His deep scholarly understanding of, and affinity with, Chinese culture, together with his imposition of increased local taxes made him unpopular with the expatriate European trading community in Hong Kong. "This sumptuous work describes Hamilton's first collection of vases, which was sold to the British Museum in 1772. Shortly after his appointment as envoy to Naples in 1764 Hamilton began collecting vases. Hugues, a self-made antiquarian who had worked with Winckelmann and had close connections with the Dilettanti Society, acted as Hamilton's agent and assisted him in amassing his collection in a relatively short period, the basis of which was the purchase of the Greek vases belonging to the Porcarini family in 1766... This work is of great importance in the development of neo-classical designs for pottery and porcelain; it influenced Wedgewood especially." (Blackmer). (2)





Important expeditions with groundbreaking discoveries, Wallis discovered Tahiti and Carteret identified Pitcairn Island among other atolls. The subsequent two volumes document Cook's Endeavour expedition, in which charted "5000 miles on coastline under great difficulties" (Hill p.139). He was the first to circumnavigate New Zealand and discovered and charted New South Wales.

The map of Aberdeen was first published during the Jacobite Rebellion of 1745 - 46. Aberdeen was held by Lord Lewis Gordon who raised both men and money for the Jacobite cause. The Hanoverian commander sent an army of clansmen to attack Aberdeen and the two armies met at Inverurie - north of Aberdeen - on 23rd December 1745. The Jacobites won the day, the battle taking place just a month before this detailed plan was published. Copac records only two examples of the map of Aberdeen. The British Library's copy is in the King's Topographical Collection, bound with a manuscript version, and The National Library of Scotland's example is bound - as is this example - in volume 5 of the 'Bibliotheca Topographica Britannica'. Hollar was employed by Thomas Jenner to etch a six-sheet map of England and Wales, which was based on Christopher Saxton's wall map, and designed to be 'Useful for all Comanders for Quarteringe of Souldiers & all sorts of Persons that would be informed, where the Armies be; never so commodiously drawne before this'. The map, or set of maps was designed for utilitarian use, and therefore are often found backed with linen to facilitate ease of folding and carrying. The maps were re-printed three times between 1644 and 1688 and these later editions show the roads. John Rocque published two late editions in 1752 and 1799. (1)

R.W.Shirley. Early Printed Maps of the British Isles, 1477 - 1650, 537. Often called 'The Quartermaster's Map', this appears to be an unrecorded edition, which although published in London, has a French title and description, but retains the individual cartouche titles in English. It comprises four (of the six sheets) but was clearly published in this state as a map of southern England and Wales. The map acquired its moniker owing to its usefulness to 'all Commanders for Quarteringe of Souldiers, & all sorts of Persons, that would be informed, Where the Armies be; never so Commodiously drawne before this.' It was used widely during the English Civil War particularly by the Parliamentarians with whom the original publisher Thomas Jenner's sympathies lay. Jenner was a print and map seller who set up in business at the White Bear in Cornhill about 1618. Until the impending Civil War Jenner was not known for cartographic material. Then in 1643, he published a revised edition of the 'Direction for the English Traviller' whose plates he had acquired from his printer Matthew Simmons. Jenner had timed his move perfectly. The demand for maps to help the large numbers of people moving about the country at the time of the Civil War was on the increase. The market for the little atlas clearly proved so great that he was attracted to do more. He engaged the services of the noted engraver Wenceslaus Hollar to etch a reduction of Christopher Saxton's great wall map of 1583, thereby enabling his customers to have a more detailed and yet still portable map of England and Wales. £300 - £500 (1)



Sinclair Hood (1917-2021)

Leading British archaeologist Sinclair Hood, one of the great archaeological scholars of the 20th century, wrote extensively on the history of Minoan Crete, and led a major programme of excavations on the Minoan Palace and civilization at Knossos, while assistant director (1949-1950), and subsequently director (1954 to 1962) of the British School at Athens, following in the footsteps of the illustrious Sir Arthur Evans (1851-1941). He also excavated on the island of Chios between 1952 and 1955, uncovering the important prehistoric site of Emporio, where he introduced underwater exploration techniques.

Hood attended Harrow School, where Sir Arthur Evans, and the egyptologist Sir John Gardner Wilkinson, had also been pupils (not to mention Byron, Elgin, and the orientalist Sir William Jones). After four years at Magdalen College, Oxford (1935-39), he studied for a diploma at the Institute of Archaeology in London, under Kathleen Kenyon and subsequently Gordon Childe, after which he joined the British School at Athens. His first important field studies in the East Mediterranean were at Smyrna, and Atchana with Sir Leonard Woolley. From Woolley and Kenyon, Hood absorbed the principles of careful excavation and recording that characterized the subsequent work at Emporio, Knossos and elsewhere. Numerous articles and publications issued from him over the next 60 years, culminating in his major survey, *The Mason's Marks of Minoan Knossos* (2020). During his tenure as director of the British School at Athens, Hood oversaw the construction of the Knossos Stratigraphical Museum, providing much-needed safe storage for the extensive finds generated by BSA excavations, not only from his own, but also from older excavations, including those of Sir Arthur Evans himself.



Hood's archaeological interests extended well beyond the confines of the Aegean to include the Middle East as well as the rest of Europe. As director of the BSA he was particularly welcoming to scholars from behind the Iron Curtain, an exchange of knowledge and hospitality that greatly extended his understanding of Balkan and Eastern European archaeology, here reflected in the large number of books from his library presented to him by colleagues from Eastern Europe.

Sinclair Hood became a fellow of the British Academy in 1983, and was awarded an honorary doctorate by the University of Athens in 2000. A festschrift *Knossos, A Labyrinth of History*, with contributions from fellow scholars, was published in his honour in 1994. Amongst the more important of Hood's publications are: *The Archeological Survey of the Knossos Area* (1958), *The Home of the Heroes: the Aegean before the Greeks* (1967), *The Arts in Prehistoric Greece* (1978), *Excavations in Chios* 1938-1955: *Prehistoric Emporio and Ayio Gala I-II* (1981-82), *The Bronze Age Palace of Knossos: plan and sections* (1981), *Knossos Excavations*, 1957-61: Early Minoan, co-authored with Gerald Cadogan (2011) and *The Mason's Marks of Minoan Knossos* (2020).

The work, originally published over 146 years is based on two missions: "The two Ionian Missions - that of Richard Chandler, Nicholas Revett and William Pars, 1764-66, and of William Gell, John Gandy and Francis Bedford in 1812-13, were a major undertaking for what was a society of amateurs, however wealthy they might be as a collective body. The decision to undertake two such missions shows an amazing dedication to the aims of archaeology in what many believed to be merely an assembly of frivolous club men. The materials collected on these missions were truly impressive, especially when one considers the difficult conditions under which the men worked." (Blackmer). (5)

This skilfully executed binding is possibly the work of a member of the Working Ladies' Guild, the Ladies' Work Society, or some other such organisation set up to provide employment for impoverished gentlewomen. These charitable enterprises enabled ladies who had fallen on hard times to make a living using their needlework skills, without compromising their social standing. There was a proliferation of such societies in the late 19th century, as part of the wider Arts & Crafts Movement, producing a variety of needlework items - many made to order - such as chair covers, wall hangings, firescreens, coverlets and clothing, as well as bindings. The Working Ladies' Guild, in South Kensington, was particularly known for the production of carefully stitched bookcovers, typically incorporating metalwork, as here. First edition of the full score of Mendelssohn's Elijah, published in October 1847 shortly before the composer's death on the 4th of November at the age of just 38.

The oratorio Elijah was first conceived in the mid-1830's, shortly after the success of its predecessor, Paulus, but not completed by Mendelssohn until he received an invitation to present a major work at the Birmingham Music Festival in 1846, where it was first performed at Birmingham Town Hall on August 26, 1846, conducted by the composer. Much of the last two years of the composer's life was spent on the composition, and subsequent revision of Elijah: after the Birmingham premiere of Elijah in August 1846 Mendelssohn began to rework the score extensively (as he did with all his major compositions), regarding the actual first performance as only a step in the process of arriving at its definitive final form. This version was premiered at Exeter Hall, London in April 1847.

Elijah was hailed in Britain as a masterpiece and a worthy successor to the oratorios of Handel. After the performance on 23rd April which was attended by the Queen and Prince Albert, the Consort paid tribute to the "Noble Artist, who, surrounded by the Baal-worship of debased art, has been able, by his genius and science, to preserve faithfully, like another Elijah, the worship of true art, and once more to accustom our ear, amid the whirl of empty, frivolous sounds, to the pure tones of sympathetic feeling and legitimate harmony: to the Great Master, who makes us conscious of the unity of his conception, through the whole maze of his creation, from the soft whispering to the mighty raging of the elements". The fourth edition of the work, published in the year of the author's death at the age of 83. "A briefe and accurate treatise concerning the taking of the fume tobacco", originally published in 1621, and "The baths of Bathe" (1628) each have a separate title page dated 1660. Venner was a Somerset physician and his treatise on tobacco deplores its recreational use, but recommends it as a means of improving digestion and countering the malign effects of cold, misty weather and contagious air. Venner had a seasonal practice in Bath from as early as 1613; he was the first to write exclusively about the city's spa. 

Hallywell attempts to prove the existence of witchcraft and mentions his opinion in the introduction "this age hath produced too many over-confident exploders of immaterial substances: and he that shall talk of the existence of devils and evil spirits. their possessions of the bodies of men, of ghosts and apparitions, and the feats and practices of witches, shall be confuted with a loud laughter or a supercilious look, as if these things were only the delusions of a distempered imagination, and owed all their being and reality to the dreams and fancies of melancholick persons".

Henry Hallywell (1641-1703) was a minor Cambridge Platonist who was educated at Christ's College, Cambridge, while Ralph Cudworth was master, and Henry More was a fellow. Hallywell's tutor was George Rust, and he was responsible for preserving and publishing several of Rust's discourses. Hallywell was later associated with Benjamin Whichcote's centre of liberal preaching at St Lawrence Jewry in the City of London. All of Hallywell's writings show the influence of these Cambridge Platonist authors. He accepted Cambridge Platonist ideas on the immortality of the soul, the deiform life, enthusiasm and atheism, the paranormal, millenarianism and the public and private usefulness of rational religion. His special contribution to Cambridge Platonism was his simplified presentation of the circle's main theological themes in his pastoral role as a parish priest. This introduction to Hallywell's published and manuscript writings complements the author's account of his career as a Sussex clergyman, which is published elsewhere. This is a printer's bound file copy of 'News for the Troops', a daily Allied propaganda newspaper produced by the Psychological Warfare Division of the Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force. It was an Anglo-American venture and the inspiration of Sefton Delmer who superintended the editorial content, wrote much of the material and inspired the staff.

After trials and experiments begun in March 1944 the first edition appeared on 25 April 1944 with issue 9, as here, there deliberately being no issues numbered 1-8. It ended with no. 381 on 5 May 1945 (and the 'Extrablatt'. announcing the German surrender, included in this run).

The paper brought updated news of the war to the German troops, and for added interest and appeal it also featured sports results and pin ups. It was printed at the Luton News (Home Counties Group) then packed in large containers and dropped by Allied bombers on or behind the German Western Front. Starting with 200,000 copies a day, the print run was increased and by D-Day, 6 June 1944, the number of copies being dropped was one million a day. In total 159,898,973 copies of the newspaper were produced.

Comprising 312 of the 374 issues this is an important and very rare, nearcomplete collection of the original issues of this ephemeral propaganda publication, copies of which are more often found individually or in very small numbers. The issues missing from the collection offered here are nos. 11, 16, 18, 25, 27, 28, 30-33, 39, 46, 49, 60, 78, 88, 89, 91, 105, 119, 128, 181, 192, 249, 250, 252-254, 276, 284, 332, 333, 348, 349, 354-381. It was compiled by Richard Arthur Gibbs, managing director of County Newspapers (later Home Counties Newspapers) where these were printed and is now offered for sale by the family. (1)



THE LIBRARY OF CHARLES TOMLINSON, CBE (1927-2015)

Alfred Charles Tomlinson was an English poet, translator, academic and illustrator. He was born in Penkhull, and grew up in Basford, Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire. After attending Longton High School, Tomlinson read English at Queens' College, Cambridge, where he studied with Donald Davie. He subsequently taught for thirty-six years in the English Department of Bristol University, where he became Emeritus Professor. He was also a graphic artist, and In Black and White: The Graphics of Charles Tomlinson, with an introduction by Nobel prize-winner Octavio Paz, was published in 1975. From 1958 until his death he lived with his wife Brenda and family in the village of Ozleworth, Gloucestershire, where for a while Bruce Chatwin was a near neighbour and friend.

Tomlinson's first book of poetry was published in 1951, and his Collected Poems was published by the Oxford University Press in 1985, followed by the Selected Poems: 1955-1997 in 1997. His poetry won international recognition and received many prizes in Europe and the United States. He was an Honorary Fellow of the American Academy of the Arts and Sciences and of the Modern Language Association. Tomlinson was made a CBE in 2001 for his contribution to literature.




In his book Some Americans Tomlinson acknowledges his poetic debts to modern American poetry, in

particular William Carlos Williams, George Oppen, Marianne Moore, and Louis Zukofsky, as well as artists like Georgia O'Keeffe and Arshile Gorky. Tomlinson was also an authoritative translator of poetry from the Russian, French, Italian and Spanish, including Antonio Machado, Cesar Vallejo and Octavio Paz.

He edited the seminal Oxford Book of Verse in English Translation and the Selected Poems of William Carlos Williams. Other edited works include Marianne Moore: A Collection of Critical Essays, William Carlos Williams: A Critical Anthology, George Oppen: Selected Poems, and John Drvden: Poems.

The Charles Tomlinson Papers, including notebooks, drafts, proofs and correspondence, are held at the Harry Ransom Center, The University of Texas at Austin. The entire library of books offered here contain numerous ownership signatures, author presentation inscriptions and Tomlinson's pencil notes, offering rich insights into the creative and academic mind of this eminent poet and translator.

Please note successful bids made via live bidding cannot be invoiced or paid for until the day after an auction. A live bidding fee of 3% + VAT (Dominic Winter / Invaluable) or 4.95% + VAT (the-saleroom) will be added to your invoice.

METHODS OF PAYMENT

Cheque: Cheques will only be accepted on the day of the sale by prior arrangement (please contact our office for further information). Cheques by post will be accepted but a period of 5 working days will be required for the cheque to clear before purchases can be collected or posted.

Cash: Payments can be made at the Cashier's Office, either during or after the sale.

Debit Card: There is no additional charge for purchases made with debit cards in the UK.

Credit Cards: We accept Visa and Mastercard. It is advisable to let your card provider know in advance if you are intending to purchase. This reduces the time needed to obtain authorisation when the payment is made.

Bank Transfer: All transfers must state the relevant invoice number. If transferring from a foreign currency, the amount we receive must be the total due after the currency conversion and the deduction of any bank charges.

Note to Overseas Clients: All payments must be made by bank transfer only. No card payments will be accepted unless by special prior arrangements with the auctioneers.

Collection/Postage/Delivery: If you attend the auction in person and are successful in your bid, you are free to collect your item once payment has been made.

Successful commission or live bids will be invoiced to you the day after the sale. When it is possible for our in-house packing department to send your purchase(s), a charge for postage/packing/insurance will be included in your invoice. ARTIST'S RESALE RIGHT LAW ("DROIT DE SUITE")

Lots marked with **AR** next to the lot number may be subject to Droit de Suite.

Droit de Suite is payable on the hammer price of any artwork sold in the lifetime of the artist, or within 70 years of the artist's death. The buyer agrees to pay Dominic Winter Auctioneers Ltd. an amount equal to the resale royalty and we will pay such amount to the artist's collecting agent. Resale royalty applies where the Hammer price is 1,000 Euros or more and the amount cannot be more than 12,500 Euros per lot.

The amount is calculated as follows:RoyaltyFor the Portion of the Hammer Price (in Euros)4.00%up to 50,0003.00%between 50,000.01 and 200,0001.00%between 200,000.01 and 350,0000.50%between 350,000.01 and 500,000

Invoices will, as usual, be issued in Pounds Sterling. For the purposes of calculating the resale royalty the Pounds Sterling/Euro rate of exchange will be the European Central Bank reference rate on the day of the sale.

CONDITIONS OF SALE AND BUSINESS

- The Seller warrants to the Auctioneer and the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims.
- (a) The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
 - (b) Where goods are bought at auction by a buyer who has entered into an agreement with another or others that the other or others (or some of them) shall abstain from bidding for the goods and the buyer or other party or one of the other parties is a dealer (as defined in the Auction Biddings Agreement Act 1927) the buyer warrants that the goods are bought bona fide on joint account.
- 3. The buyer shall pay the price at which a lot is knocked down by the Auctioneer to the buyer ("the hammer price") together with a premium of 20% of the hammer price. Where the lot is marked by an asterisk the premium will be subject to VAT at 20% which under the Auctioneer's Margin Scheme will form part of the buyer's premium on our invoice and will not be separately identified (the premium added to the hammer price will hereafter collectively be referred to as "the total sum due"). By making any bid the buyer acknowledges that his attention has been drawn to the fact that on the sale of any lot the Auctioneer will receive from the seller commission at its usual rates in addition to the said commission.
- (a) The buyer shall forthwith upon the purchase give in his name and permanent address and pay to the Auctioneer immediately after the conclusion of the auction the total sum due.
 - (b) The buyer may be required to pay down during the course of the sale the whole or any part of the total sum due, and if he fails to do so after such request the lot or lots may at the Auctioneer's absolute discretion be put up again and resold immediately.

Every person interested should exercise and rely on his own judgement as to such matters and neither the Auctioneer nor his servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions. No warranty whatsoever is given by the Auctioneer or the seller in respect of any lot and any express or implied warranties are hereby excluded.
- 8. (a) Notwithstanding any other terms of these conditions, if within fourteen days of the sale the Auctioneer has received from the buyer of any lot notice in writing that in his view the lot is a deliberate forgery and within fourteen days after such notification the buyer returns the same to the Auctioneer in the same condition as at the time of the sale and satisfies the Auctioneer that considered in the light of the entry in the catalogue the lot is a deliberate forgery then the sale of the lot will be rescinded and the purchase price of the same refunded. "A deliberate forgery" means a lot made with intention to deceive.
 - (b) A buyer's claim under this condition shall be limited to any amount paid to the Auctioneer for the lot and for the purpose of this condition the buyer shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by the Auctioneer.
- 9. Lots may be removed during the sale after full settlement in accordance with 4(d) hereof.


