Alexander Davison (1750–1829) of Swarland Park, Northumberland, was a merchant, manufacturer, banker, ship and land owner. Originally a clerk in the house of Robert Hunter & Co, merchants in London, he was sent out by them to Quebec, where he resided some time. He became a personal friend of Admiral Lord Nelson from their first meeting in Quebec in 1782, and was appointed sole Prize Agent for the sale of ships taken at the Battle of the Nile in 1798. On his return, he set up in business in London, married the daughter of Mr Gosling, a wealthy banker, and was admitted as first partner in a bank in Pall Mall. He amassed a large fortune as a government contractor and purchased Swarland Park in 1795. He later erected an obelisk on the estate in memory of Nelson in 1807. Davison was tried in 1808 for fraud in taking commissions for goods he supplied to the army as a merchant. He was found guilty, repaid the money and was imprisoned at Newgate for a term of 21 months.

First edition of one of Smith's rarest works with fine engravings of fossils by James Sowerby (1757-1822). The work is a highly original presentation of Smith's discovery of the correlation of particular groups of fossil types with different geological strata, with each fossil group printed on a differently coloured paper, intended to match the shade of the respective geological stratum depicted. Smith originally intended to publish the work in seven parts, but only four were published. The only two complete copies to have sold at auction since 1975 were the Norman copy (Christie's New York, 29 October 1998, lot 1300) and a copy from Worcester Libraries (Dominic Winter, 16 January 2011, lot 195). Both those copies lacked the wrappers but retained the frontispiece and included Smith's *Stratigraphical System* (1817).



The John Miller of London and William Blackwood edition of Gillray's caricatures was published between 1824 and 1827. Nicholas Spierinck (d. 1545) was a Dutch immigrant who came to Cambridge soon after 1500 and became established as one of the leading stationers there, running a successful business selling and binding books. He was one of the first generation of University Stationers, appointed in 1534. He had a small group of rolls which were regularly used in varying combinations on books from his bindery, some of them incorporating his initials N.S. The layout of the rolls, with vertical strips within the frame, was a pattern often used in Cambridge.

Provenance: The early owner (stamped initials H. H. on both covers) would have had royal connections and it may well be that these initials were added slightly after the binding was made. One candidate is Henry Hastings, 3rd Earl of Huntingdon (c. 1535-1595). Educated alongside the future Edward VI, Mary I briefly imprisoned him, and he was later considered by some as a potential successor to Elizabeth I. He hotly opposed the scheme to marry Mary, Queen of Scots, to the Duke of Norfolk, and was entrusted by Elizabeth to see that the Scottish queen did not escape at the time of the threatened uprising in 1569. He had connections with Lady Jane Grey. Another potentially less likely candidate is that of Henry Herbert, 2nd Earl of Pembroke (c. 1538-1601), the nephew of Katherine Parr, who was briefly married to Lady Jane Grey's sister, Lady Katherine Grey, in a political marriage arranged in 1553.

There is a signed autograph note concerning the book loosely inserted. It was written by Henry Thomas Wake (1831–1924), a noted bookseller from Fritchley, Derby, and dated 27 January [18]90. Unlike the slightly later printed catalogue description pasted in at the back of the book Wake believed that the Cromwell signature was authentic and that this copy had formerly belonged to him. In our opinion, (as that of the cataloguer for the printed description), the signature is spurious and in an unidentified hand. Wake also notes the tooling devices and suggests that the book 'probably belonged to the family of King Henry 8'.







He declared the existence of antichthones in the southern temperate zone made it uninhabitable by persons from the northern temperate regions because of the unbearable heat. Mela's work was first published in Venice in 1478, and Vadianus' commentary was initially published in Basel in 1522, including a short passage relating to America.

CONDITIONS OF SALE AND BUSINESS

- The Seller warrants to the Auctioneer and the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims.
- 2. (a) The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
 - (b) Where goods are bought at auction by a buyer who has entered into an agreement with another or others that the other or others (or some of them) shall abstain from bidding for the goods and the buyer or other party or one of the other parties is a dealer (as defined in the Auction Biddings Agreement Act 1927) the buyer warrants that the goods are bought bona fide on joint account.
- 3. The buyer shall pay the price at which a lot is knocked down by the Auctioneer to the buyer ("the hammer price") together with a premium of 22% of the hammer price. - 5. (a) If the buyer fails to pay for or take away any lot or lots pursuant to clause 4 or breaches any other condition of that clause the Auctioneer as agent for the seller shall be entitled after consultation with the seller to exercise one or other of the following rights:
 - (i) Rescind the sale of that or any other lots sold to the buyer who defaults and re-sell the lot or lots whereupon the defaulting buyer shall pay to the Auctioneer any shortfall between the proceeds of that sale after deduction of costs of re-sale and the total sum due. Any surplus shall belong to the seller.
 - (ii) Proceed for damages for breach of contract.
 - (b) Without prejudice to the Auctioneer's rights hereunder if any lots or lots are not collected within five days or such longer period as the Auctioneer may have agreed otherwise, the Auctioneer may charge the buyer a storage charge of £1.00 + VAT at the current rate per lot per day.
 - (c) Ownership of the lot purchased shall not pass to the buyer until he has paid to the Auctioneer the total sum due.
- 6. (a) The seller shall be entitled to place a reserve on any lot and the Auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the seller for any lot on which a reserve has been placed. A seller may not bid on any lot on which a reserve has been placed.
 - (b) Where any lot fails to sell, the Auctioneer shall notify the seller accordingly. The seller shall make arrangements either to re-offer the lot for sale or to collect the lot and may be asked to pay a commission not exceeding 50% of the selling commission and any special expenses incurred in cataloguing the lot.
 - (c) If such arrangements are not made within seven days of the notification the Auctioneer is empowered to sell the lot by auction or by private treaty at not less than the reserve price and to receive from the seller the normal selling commission and special expenses.

- 7. Any representation or statement by the Auctioneer in any catalogue, brochure or advertisement of forthcoming sales as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his own judgement as to such matters and neither the Auctioneer nor his servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions. No warranty whatsoever is given by the Auctioneer or the seller in respect of any lot and any express or implied warranties are hereby excluded.
- 8. (a) Notwithstanding any other terms of these conditions, if within fourteen days of the sale the Auctioneer has received from the buyer of any lot notice in writing that in his view the lot is a deliberate forgery and within fourteen days after such notification the buyer returns the same to the Auctioneer in the same condition as at the time of the sale and satisfies the Auctioneer that considered in the light of the entry in the catalogue the lot is a deliberate forgery then the sale of the lot will be rescinded and the purchase price of the same refunded.
 "A deliberate forgery" means a lot made with intention to deceive.
 - (b) A buyer's claim under this condition shall be limited to any amount paid to the Auctioneer for the lot and for the purpose of this condition the buyer shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by the Auctioneer.
- 9. Lots may be removed during the sale after full settlement in accordance with 4(d) hereof.
- 10. All goods delivered to the Auctioneer's premises will be deemed to be delivered for sale by auction unless otherwise stated in writing and will be catalogued and sold at the Auctioneer's discretion and accepted by the Auctioneer subject to all these conditions. In the case of miscellaneous books, the Auctioneer reserves the right to extract and dispose of books that, in the opinion of the Auctioneer at his absolute discretion, have no saleable value and, therefore, might detract from the saleability of the rest of the lot and the Auctioneer shall incur no liability to the seller, in respect of the books disposed of. By delivering the goods to the Auctioneer for inclusion in his auction sales each seller acknowledges that he/she accepts and agrees to all the conditions.
- 11. (a) Unless otherwise instructed in writing all goods on the Auctioneer's premises and in their custody will be held insured against the risks of fire, burglary, water damage and accidental breakage or damage. The value of the goods so covered will be the hammer price, or in the case of unsold lots the lower estimate, or in the case of loss or damage prior to the sale that which the specialised staff of the Auctioneer shall in their absolute discretion estimate to be the auction value of such goods.
 - (b) The Auctioneer shall not be responsible for damage to or the loss, theft, or destruction of any goods not so insured because of the owner's written instructions.
- 12. The Auctioneer shall remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller thirty days after the day of the auction provided that the Auctioneer has received the total sum due from the buyer. In all other cases the Auctioneer will remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller within seven days of the receipt by the Auctioneer of the total sum due. The Auctioneer will not be deemed to have received the total sum due until after any cheque delivered by the buyer has been cleared. In the event of the Auctioneer exercising his right to rescind the sale his obligation to the seller hereunder lapses.
- 13. In the case of the seller withdrawing instructions to the Auctioneer to sell any lot or lots, the Auctioneer may charge a fee of 12.5% of the Auctioneer's middle estimate of the auction price of the lot withdrawn together with Value Added Tax thereon and any expenses incurred in respect of the lot or lots.
- 14. The Auctioneer's current standard notices and information (i.e. Collation and Amendments) will apply to any contract with the Auctioneer as if incorporated herein.
- These conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English Law.
