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

1* **Shipwreck relic.** A pewter plate recovered from the wreck of HMS Stirling Castle in 1703, the plate 24cm, damaged and loose in a glass frame laid on a modern shipwreck chart with laminated history of the ship, framed size 53 x 42.5cm, certificate of authenticity to verso

HMS Stirling Castle was a 70-gun third-rate ship of the line, built for the Royal Navy in 1679. She was wrecked on the Goodwin Sands off Deal, Kent on 27 November 1703. She dragged her anchor, slowing the ship's progress towards the Goodwin Sands at high tide, but as the tides turned the ship was dragged sideways, trapping her between the new tidal currents and the oncoming storms, the seas swamped the ship filling her full of water and she sank onto the sands. There were 70 survivors from a crew of 349. The wreck was discovered by divers in 1979, the plate was recovered by the Thanet Archaeological Unit (Marine Section)





HERBERT GEORGE BRACKLEY (1894–1948)

Air Commodore Herbert George Brackley CBE, DSO, DSC, FRGS, FRAes Ordre de la Couronne Belgique, Croix de Guerre (1894-1948) enlisted in the Royal Naval Air Service (RNAS) in April 1915 and gained his Royal Aero Club Certificate No 1474 on 27 July 1915, he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross in May 1917 and appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order in June 1917, both awards for his exploits as a night bomber pilot.

Known to friends and colleagues as 'Brackles', he left the RAF after the end of the war and commenced a career in civil aviation as Chief of the Air Department of Handley Page Transport. He went to Newfoundland with a Handley Page V/1500 in order to attempt the trans-Atlantic crossing but was beaten in the attempt by Alcock & Brown and so flew the other way and completed the first flight from Newfoundland to New .

In 1921 Brackley joined the British Air Mission as an Air Adviser to the Imperial Japanese Naval Air Service and spent the next three years helping in the organisation and training of the Japanese Naval Air Arm. Returning to Britain in 1924, he joined the newly formed Imperial Airways his task was to plan operations and organise training as well as carry out route development. He flew the first scheduled flight in the new Armstrong Whitworth Argosy from Paris to London on 5th August 1926 and he personally surveyed the route taken by the new four-engined flying boats between England and Australia

Recalled to service in 1939, he was initially assigned to RAF Coastal Command where his experience with flying boats and trans-Atlantic flights proved useful.

Amongst his post-war achievements was the successful evacuation of 35,000 people from India to Pakistan following the partition of India.

Brackley sadly lost his life in a swimming accident in Rio de Janeiro on 15th November 1948.

Believed to have been worn by Brackley during his attempt at the first Transatlantic flight in 1919.

Brackley (Herbert, 1894-1948). A Cartier silver presentation cigarette case. with gold monogram of the King and Queen of Belgium, on an engine turned ground, the interior engraved 'To Major Brackley R.A.F. In remembrance of our trip to Ostend from St Pol 18th October 1918 Albert Elisabeth, engraved 'Cartier Paris Londres along the inner rim, 8 x 8.5cm together with a pair of signed photographs of the King and Queen of Belgium, one inscribed 'To Major Brackley, Cairo Baghdad Cairo, 15 21 March 31, Albert' the other 'A Monsieur Robert Mond Elizabeth. Egypte 1930', each in a carved gilt wood commemorative frame with crown finial On the 18 October 1918 Major Brackley flew in H.p9696 from St. Inglevert to St. Pol to pick up the King and Queen of the Belgians, BrigadierGeneral Lambe and others, he was escorted by 6 Camels from 204 Squadron. The Queen sat beside Brackley for the flight, they flew round Ostende several times and near Bruges, which was still occupied by Germans. The Queen took many photographs and the flight took 1hr40 mins.

The second piece features a letter from balloonist Don Cameron suggesting that these blades were used for ground running tests, while another writer suggests that these were test 'clubs' or fans as utilised for the development or overhaul testing of the piston engine, and that these may have been supplied by the Airscrew Company. Subsequent enquiries in 2010 by the vendor with the Fleet Air Arm Museum concurs that this was very likely used in engine testing.

R101 was built as part of a British government initiative to develop airships to provide passenger and mail transport from Britain to the most distant parts of the British Empire, since these distances were too great for heavier-than-air aircraft of the period. The Burney Scheme of 1922 had proposed a civil airship development programme to be carried out by a specially established subsidiary of Vickers with the support of the British government, but when the General Election of 1923 brought Ramsay MacDonald's Labour administration to power the new Air Minister, Lord Thomson, formulated the Imperial Airship Scheme in its place. This called for the building of two experimental airships: one, R101, to be designed and constructed under direction of the Air Ministry, and the other, R100 (designed by Barnes Wallis), to be built by a Vickers subsidiary, the Airship Guarantee Company, under a fixed-price contract.

Following years of design, development and testing the R100 made her maiden flight on 16 December 1929 and on 29 July 1930 made a successful 78-hour transatlantic voyage to Canada. Meanwhile, there was enormous political pressure for the R101 to fly before it was ready to do so. On the evening of 4 October 1930, it departed from Cardington for India with a crowd of VIPs on board. It never arrived, crashing in bad weather over France, and bursting into flames. Among the passengers killed were Lord Thomson, the Air Minister who had initiated the programme, senior government officials, and almost all the dirigible's designers from the Royal Airship Works. The disaster led to the R100 also being grounded, and the British government abandoned all thoughts of flying airships (as the rest of the world was to do after the *Hindenburg* disaster in 1937).


In the early 1960s, various executives of US aerospace companies were telling the US public and Congress that there were no technical reasons an SST could not be produced. In April 1960, Burt C Monesmith, a vice president with Lockheed, stated that an SST constructed of steel weighing 250,000 pounds (110,000 kg) could be developed. But it was the Anglo-French development of the Concorde that set off panic in the US industry, where it was thought that Concorde would soon replace all other long range designs, especially after Pan Am took out purchase options on the Concorde.

Congress was soon funding an SST design effort, selecting the existing Lockheed L-2000 and Boeing 2707 designs, to produce an even more advanced, larger, faster and longer ranged design. The Boeing 2707 design was eventually selected for continued work, with design goals of ferrying around 300 passengers and having a cruising speed near to Mach 3. None of the U.S. SST went into production.



Keppel went on to be Commander-in-Chief at Cape of Good Hope and West Coast of Africa station, then Commander-in-Cheif, South East Coast of America station also China station and finally in Plymouth.

SMS Konigsberg was launched in 1905, and served in the High Seas Fleet's reconnaissance force. She frequently escorted Kaiser Wilhelm II's yacht on visits to foreign countries. In April 1914, the ship was sent on what was to have been a two-year deployment to German East Africa, but this was interrupted by the outbreak of WWI and called up for military service. In July 1915 Konigsberg was stationed in the Rufji River for repair work to her engines. Before the repairs could be finished, British cruisers located her, and, unable to steam into the river to destroy her, set up a blockade. After several attempts to sink the ship during the Battle of Fufiji Delta, the British sent two monitors, Mersey and Severn, to destroy the German cruiser. On 11 July 1915, the two monitors got close enough to severely damage Konigsberg, forcing her crew to scuttle the ship. The surviving crew salvaged all ten of her main guns and joined Lieutenant Colonel Paul von Lettow-Vorbeck's guerrilla campaign in East Africa.

Major Walter Fleischl O.B.E., R.A.O.C. (1892–1956), was the second son of an Austrian born wool worker, he was educated at Charterhouse School and the University of Lausanne. He joined the army at the outbreak of WWI and served in East Africa reaching the rank of major. In 1919 he changed his name by deed poll to Walter Fletcher and became a Conservative politician. During WWII Fletcher worked for the Special Operation Executive (S.O.E.), being involved in an operation smuggling foreign currency, diamonds and machinery to fund S.O.E. activities.



In 1936 joined the SS Pacific President as 2nd Officer and on Thursday 28 November 1940 convoy OB251 sailed from Liverpool with 33 merchant ships plus 4 escorts which included SS Pacific President, at 0900 hours on 2 December 1940 the Pacific President was hit by 2 torpedoes from U-43 and sank quickly by the bow, there were no survivors from her 52 crew. Rylands is commemorated on the Tower Hill Memorial, London.







The important Napoleonic era naval archive relating to Captain Sir George Augustus Westphal (later an Admiral on the Retired List) – one of the heroes of the Battle of Trafalgar where he was a Midshipman aboard Nelson's Flag Ship, HMS *Victory*, and upon whom command of the Main Deck devolved at about 3pm, until he himself was severely wounded in the head, taken below and laid by Admiral Nelson: Nelson's tunic was rolled up beneath his head as a pillow and when it came to treating his wounds it had adhered to the dried blood on his head such that part of it had to be cut away. Westphal long treasured this memento of his sponsor and commander.

Westphal saw much more distinguished service in Home Waters and in the North Americas, notably during the battle of New Orleans, where he was one of few senior officers to emerge with credit. He was 'under fire against the Enemy, it is no exaggeration to say, upwards of One Hundred Times. His conduct upon all occasions has merited the approbation of his superiors'. Upon his death in 1875, aged ninety, he was the last surviving Royal Navy officer to have fought at Trafalgar on board HMS *Victory*.

It is true, they expected an attack on the IIth but as nothing happened, and as of the I7th, a German Divisional General after a visit to the front line, reported that all was quiet, all suspicions were set at rest.

On the I8th July at 4,35 am, without artillery preparation, 321 light tanks leaped to the attack, the Great Counter-Offensive, between the Aisnes and the Ource, The enemy could not resist for the morals of the French troops and the Allies was at its zenith. I6000 prisonersXXs fell into our hands Once started the battle extended to the right up to Rheims.

Dormans yielded no information whatever on raids, having been totally evacuated in May.

The next morning we set out for Verneuil, Ville-en-Taraennois, Fiemes, etc.

Gerald George Wynne Trevredyn Tait (1891-1954), was commission a temporary 2nd Lieutenant in the Northumberland Fusiliers in September 1914, employed as an interpreter, and appointed temporary Captain in September 1915. In May 1916 he was appointed a General Staff Officer Grade 3 and transferred to the General List but transferred back to the Northumberland Fusiliers with a rank of Captain in August the same year. In January 1917 he was specially appointed a Staff Lieutenant 2nd Class and transferred to the General List. In March 1918 he relinquished his special appointment and was appointed a General Staff Officer Grade 3 for liaison duties with the French Army. In May 1918 he was appointed a Staff Officer 3rd Class with the Royal Air Force with the rank of Captain.

Tait's mission began in Cologne with Captain Williamson and their driver in a Crossley tender "loaded up with kit, camera and accessories, spare parts, tyres, wheels, petrol and food [which] looked more like a gypsy caravan that a serious military conveyance". The journey concluded three months later having covered some 11,000 miles.

The object of the Committee was "to investigate, on the spot, the results of our bomb raids in France and Belgium; that is to say raids carried out by the RAF over territory occupied by the Germans". Tait provides a full and detailed record of the course of his investigative journey through the devastated regions, incorporating snapshots and various other photographs relating to events, including official aerial photographs and photographs of various bomb damaged sites, etc.

Following his appointment to head the RAF Bombing Investigation Committee, Tait was placed on the Unemployed List at the end of 1919 and in the following year was appointed a Captain at the Bengal Nagpur Railway Regiment, attaining the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 1929. Tait went on to work for the publicity department of the Indian State Railways, designing posters and other publicity materials. With the onset of WWII he obtained an emergency commission in the Indian Army and was ranked as a temporary Captain in September 1941. He served as a Staff Officer with the 11th Indian Division and on 15 February 1942 was captured by the Japanese in Malaya. For his wartime services in India he was mentioned in despatches (London Gazette, 19 July 1945).



According to the typescript reports the object of secret operation Barn Owl was 'To proceed to Bentinck Island ... in the Isthmus of Kra, and collect eight Japanese prisoners, who had stumbled on four British agents, under Capt. Nichols, of the Kachen Levies'; that of Balmoral was 'To proceed with two U. S. Army Lietuenants, and one Malay guide, and drop them on Davis Island, 16 miles to the S.W. of Victoria Point, on the Burmese Siam border. They were to send back movements and strength of Japanese convoys moving between Singapore and Rangoon. Secondarily, to chart the waters around the local islands and recco them with a view to future landings'.

THE LIBRARY OF LT COL R J WYATT MBE TD (1931-2019) PART I

Bob Wyatt was born in Charlton in 1931 and educated at Ipswich School following evacuation from London. At the end of the war he became an apprentice electrician, joining the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in 1952 and returning to civilian life at the end of the decade. He began working for the Automobile Association in 1960 and became their Transport Manager until his retirement in 1990. He also enlisted in the AA's Royal Military Police Territorial Army unit from which he retired, commanding with the rank of Brevet Lieutenant Colonel being awarded the Territorial Declaration and the MBE in 1981.

It was while in service with the REME that his passion for all things military began, and over the next 60 years he assembled the largest military history library in private hands in the UK. He became a well-respected military historian, editing the journal of the Military Historical Society, and over a 27-year period over 110 quarterly bulletins and special numbers. He was also involved with the Western Front Association and the Stand To magazine, offering articles and advice for over 30 years.

His other passions included local history and motoring history, notably the Austin motor car. He founded the Vintage Austin Register and his 14 published books included several on the history of that company and the Austin 7 car.

Bob had settled in Wokingham with his two sons and daughter in the 1960s and there he served as a councillor for 30 years and as a town and borough mayor. He also was the patron of many charities and governor of local schools. He was given the accolade of Alderman of Wokingham and posthumously awarded the Freedom of the town. Having spent countless weekends with his son Michael over the last 50 years or so, going to book fairs and bookshops to pick up books, Michael has decided that it is time for others to enjoy his dad's book collecting legacy and have the opportunity to enjoy the collection as they both did together throughout many happy years.

Ivor William Gilmour Beddoes (1909-1981) was a British painter, sketch and storyboard artist, costume and set designer, dancer, composer and poet. He is best known for his film work, spanning more than thirty years, from Black Narcissus and The Red Shoes to Star Wars and Superman.

Prior to his being called up at the end of 1940, and then serving with the Royal Signal Corps, Beddoes had been working at the Windmill Theatre in London's West End. In an autobiographical made some written shortly before his death, Beddoes wrote: 'one night in 1940 I walked off the stage to become a stretcherbearer in the blitz on London. Then I went into the army, I never went back into the profession.' In a letter to the Artist's Advisory Committee of the Ministry of Information, (dated 10 October 1940), Beddoes explains how he came to make these remarkable drawings: '... [I] submit to you the accompanying sketches in the hope that they might be of use as documentary evidence or, in any other way that you might think useful. I am a scenic designer, and happened to be watching the raid last Saturday afternoon from the roof of a building in Piccadilly Circus. I was able to make a quick sketch of the effects of fires caused by the bombs dropped on South London, and again, later in the evening I made two sketches with colour notes of the fire, and added the colour afterwards. Should the sketches be of any use to you, I should be pleased if you would accept them and perhaps any future sketches I may make when I join the army in the very near future.'

In 1999 Maggs Bros., London, issued Catalogue 1271, in which they offered the Ivor Beddoes El Alamein archive of 108 works on paper and noted, in reference to Beddoes' blitz drawings, that 'sadly, the sketches of that raid were not accepted and their whereabouts are unknown'. A copy of this catalogue is included with the lot, with Bob Wyatt's added manuscript footnote indicating that he now has these blitz drawings in his collection.

A monumental, unpublished work by the seemingly unknown Arthur Noel Ingram (1889-1960). Ingram served in the 4th Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment during World War One, being appointed Second Lieutenant on 14 October 1914. He was appointed Lieutenant with the Royal Regiment of Artillery on 18 December 1940 and Captain on 4 February 1941. In an initialled preface dated at Ewell, 1951, Ingram describes the scope of work: 'The object of this series of books, the first complete one of its kind, is to place on record an authentic and comprehensive catalogue of the swords used by our fighting men from the year 1600 AD to the present day... the author has been engaged in research for the last twenty-five years, and no illustration or detail appears which has not been taken from the actual weapon, and where the specimen is known to exist, that has not yet been examined, a space is left vacant, as it is hoped that some at any rate will eventually come to light and enable an illustration to be made and details ascertained for publication in supplement form subsequently. Further volumes will deal with - Household, Heavy, and Light Cavalry, Artillery, Infantry, Light Troops and Light Officers, Departmental, Bayonets, Band Swords and Swords of the East India Company'. Ingram acknowledges the friends who have assisted with the project, 'Particularly to Sir James Man, who made research at the Tower of London a real pleasure, the Library of the Royal United Services Institution, G.W. Latham Esq., of Wilkinson Sword Company, and to my very great friends Captain Newgent Bosanquet, CVO, RN and S. Dudley Ward whose invaluable help has made this work possible'. In a loose typed threepage preface Ingram notes: 'This work is altogether not intended as a comprehensive treatise, but primarily as a help to those collectors who may have acquired a piece which they prize as an exquisite work of art, but have no knowledge of the date of its manufacture, or the country of its origin, also whether it is in its complete form or whether a piece of the hilt is missing or - a question that occurs frequently - whether the shortness in the blade is due to accident or design, or what type of scabbard belongs to it'.

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- 2. (a) The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
 - (b) Where goods are bought at auction by a buyer who has entered into an agreement with another or others that the other or others (or some of them) shall abstain from bidding for the goods and the buyer or other party or one of the other parties is a dealer (as defined in the Auction Biddings Agreement Act 1927) the buyer warrants that the goods are bought bona fide on joint account.
- 3. The buyer shall pay the price at which a lot is knocked down by the Auctioneer to the buyer ("the hammer price") together with a premium of 20% of the hammer price. Where the lot is marked by an asterisk the premium will be subject to VAT at 20% which under the Auctioneer's Margin Scheme will form part of the buyer's premium on our invoice and will not be separately identified (the premium added to the hammer price will hereafter collectively be referred to as "the total sum due"). By making any bid the buyer acknowledges that his attention has been drawn to the fact that on the sale of any lot the Auctioneer will receive from the seller commission at its usual rates in addition to the said premium of 20% and assents to the Auctioneer receiving the said commission.
- (a) The buyer shall forthwith upon the purchase give in his name and permanent address and pay to the Auctioneer immediately after the conclusion of the auction the total sum due.
 - (b) The buyer may be required to pay down during the course of the sale the whole or any part of the total sum due, and if he fails to do so after such request the lot or lots may at the Auctioneer's absolute discretion be put up again and resold immediately.
 - (c) The buyer shall at his own expense take away any lot or lots purchased no later than five working days after the auction day.

 - (i) Rescind the sale of that or any other lots sold to the buyer who defaults and re-sell the lot or lots whereupon the defaulting buyer shall pay to the Auctioneer any shortfall between the proceeds of that sale after deduction of costs of re-sale and the total sum due. Any surplus shall belong to the seller.
 - (ii) Proceed for damages for breach of contract.
 - (b) Without prejudice to the Auctioneer's rights hereunder if any lots or lots are not collected within five days or such longer period as the Auctioneer may have agreed otherwise, the Auctioneer may charge the buyer a storage charge of £1.00 + VAT at the current rate per lot per day

 - (c) If such arrangements are not made within seven days of the notification the Auctioneer is empowered to sell the lot by auction or by private treaty at not less than the reserve price and to receive from the seller the normal selling commission and special expenses.

- 7. Any representation or statement by the Auctioneer in any catalogue, brochure or advertisement of forthcoming sales as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his own judgement as to such matters and neither the Auctioneer nor his servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions. No warranty whatsoever is given by the Auctioneer or the seller in respect of any lot and any express or implied warranties are hereby excluded.
- 8. (a) Notwithstanding any other terms of these conditions, if within fourteen days of the sale the Auctioneer has received from the buyer of any lot notice in writing that in his view the lot is a deliberate forgery and within fourteen days after such notification the buyer returns the same to the Auctioneer in the same condition as at the time of the sale and satisfies the Auctioneer that considered in the light of the entry in the catalogue the lot is a deliberate forgery then the sale of the lot will be rescinded and the purchase price of the same refunded. "A deliberate forgery" means a lot made with intention to deceive.
 - (b) A buyer's claim under this condition shall be limited to any amount paid to the Auctioneer for the lot and for the purpose of this condition the buyer shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by the Auctioneer.
- 9. Lots may be removed during the sale after full settlement in accordance with 4(d) hereof.
- 10. All goods delivered to the Auctioneer's premises will be deemed to be delivered for sale by auction unless otherwise stated in writing and will be catalogued and sold at the Auctioneer's discretion and accepted by the Auctioneer subject to all these conditions. In the case of miscellaneous books, the Auctioneer reserves the right to extract and dispose of books that, in the opinion of the Auctioneer at his absolute discretion, have no saleable value and, therefore, might detract from the saleability of the rest of the lot and the Auctioneer shall incur no liability to the seller, in respect of the books disposed of. By delivering the goods to the Auctioneer for inclusion in his auction sales each seller acknowledges that he/she accepts and agrees to all the conditions.
- 11. (a) Unless otherwise instructed in writing all goods on the Auctioneer's premises and in their custody will be held insured against the risks of fire, burglary, water damage and accidental breakage or damage. The value of the goods so covered will be the hammer price, or in the case of unsold lots the lower estimate, or in the case of loss or damage prior to the sale that which the specialised staff of the Auctioneer shall in their absolute discretion estimate to be the auction value of such goods.
 - (b) The Auctioneer shall not be responsible for damage to or the loss, theft, or destruction of any goods not so insured because of the owner's written instructions.
- 12. The Auctioneer shall remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller thirty days after the day of the auction provided that the Auctioneer has received the total sum due from the buyer. In all other cases the Auctioneer will remit the proceeds of the sale to the seller within seven days of the receipt by the Auctioneer of the total sum due. The Auctioneer will not be deemed to have received the total sum due until after any cheque delivered by the buyer has been cleared. In the event of the Auctioneer exercising his right to rescind the sale his obligation to the seller hereunder lapses.
- 13. In the case of the seller withdrawing instructions to the Auctioneer to sell any lot or lots, the Auctioneer may charge a fee of 12.5% of the Auctioneer's middle estimate of the auction price of the lot withdrawn together with Value Added Tax thereon and any expenses incurred in respect of the lot or lots.
- 14. The Auctioneer's current standard notices and information (i.e. Collation and Amendments) will apply to any contract with the Auctioneer as if incorporated herein.
