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Della Robbia record set thanks to core appeal

Some strong bids were achieved in 2024 for the best of the Della Robbia Pottery but none higher than the £14,000 tendered at Woolley & Wallis (plus 26% buyer's premium) on December 3 for a large plaque by Cassandra Annie Walker.

It is thought to be an auction record for the short-lived but influential Birkenhead factory.

According to Peter Hyland's *The Della Robbia Pottery* book, *The Apple Gatherer* was first shown at the Walker Art Gallery in the autumn of 1900 and was illustrated that year in both *The Home Arts and Industries* and *The Studio* magazines.

London Art Week festival calls it a day after 10 years

After 10 years, London Art Week (LAW) has folded. Citing changes in the UK capital's art market and financial shortfalls, the board said the December showing of the twice-yearly festival of traditional art will be the last.

The six directors of *LAW* formally announced the closure in an email sent on December 12. It expressed pride in what *LAW* has achieved and thanked exhibitors, sponsors, partners, visitors and staff for "a wonderful winter edition" that it described as "a cheerful and uplifting way to close this chapter of *London Art Week*".

Measuring 19 x 23in (47 x 57cm), the subject matter in low relief is an Art Nouveau maiden with billowing blonde hair clutching a bowl of apples against a backdrop of autumnal leaves.

At the time it was priced at £2.10s in its wooden frame.

Several examples are known. Another with restoration (it had been broken in half) was sold by Woolley & Wallis in November 2015 for £4000. It was signed bottom right *CAW* and dated 1900.

The recent example, offered in Salisbury as part of "an important private collection" was dated 3/1900. The estimate was £3000-5000 with bidding coming from two US bidders and the eventual winner, a UK collection.

Cassandra Annie Walker (1875-1936) was one of Della Robbia's best and longest-serving designers and artists, working in Birkenhead for its duration from 1894-1906. As with all of those who worked there, she would have executed her own designs as well as some by others.

Rhyme theme

Elsewhere at the sale, a set of 10 Pilkington's Lancastrian nursery rhyme tiles was quite possibly unique.

Designed in 1917 by wood engraver Margaret Pilkington (1891-1974), each 9 x 6in (22 x 15cm) tube-lined tile is housed in an ebonised wood frame. The set came by descent from Lawrence

Burton, former managing director at Pilkington's and later the chairman of Pilkington's Lancastrian Pottery Society. It hammered at the lower end of the $\pounds 8000-12,000$ estimate.

A rare William De Morgan eight-tile panel took £14,000 (estimate £6000-10,000).

This 6ft 5in (1.7m) frieze of a central

owl flanked by four eagles to each side to a cobalt ground was created for a fireplace mantel.

It came by descent from the family of English architect Halsey Ricardo (1854-1928) who worked in partnership with De Morgan for 10 years, designing tiles, vases, and other artefacts. A watercolour from 1912 showing this tile frieze in the background is pictured in Jon Catleugh's book William De Morgan Tiles.

A group of four De Morgan ruby lustre animal tiles all went well above the guide of £800-1200 each. Leading the quartet with a bid of £4200 was a design of two rabbits decorated on a Minton Hollins blank.

Bible by 'Sarum Master' returns to cathedral following successful fundraising campaign and post-sale deal struck

A bible written and illuminated by one of the greatest manuscript illuminators of his time has returned to Salisbury Cathedral 700 years after being written there.

Friends of the Nations' Libraries (FNL) has donated the 13th-century bible by 'the Sarum Master' after acquiring the book for £90,000 with help from public donations.

The bible was originally offered at Sotheby's on July 2 with a £100,000-150,000 estimate but went unsold. FNL then raised the money to buy the manuscript after agreeing



to the price with the consignor via Sotheby's. A £10,000 donation was made by the Old Possum's Practical Trust, a cultural knowledge charity founded by Valerie Eliot, TS Eliot's wife.

The FNL, which helps save

the UK's written and printed history, awards grants to national, regional and specialist collecting libraries, enabling them to acquire rare books, manuscripts, literary archives, fine bindings and estate archives. **Left:** the Sarum Master bible at Salisbury Cathedral Library (L to R: Reverend Edward Probert, Dr Anne Dutton and The Very Revd Nicholas Papadopulos, Dean of Salisbury).

The Sarum Master was working in Salisbury during the city's artistic peak in the 1200s. The bible is one of only six manuscripts definitively attributed to the artist.

The city - known as New Sarum at the time of the book's creation - boasted the first professional book illuminators in England along with Oxford.

"Because Salisbury had a book trade, manuscripts were available for purchase which no other diocese could match," medieval manuscript specialist Christopher de Hamel says. "Thus, the local use of Sarum became standard for all of southern England and, at the Reformation, for the Book of Common Prayer."

Now, plans are being made to have open days for the public to view the work, as well as lectures and study days, the FNL said.

The Very Reverend Nicholas Papadopulos, Dean of Salisbury, said: "We are hugely grateful to the Friends of the Nations' Libraries for their work in raising the funds to bring the Sarum Bible back to Salisbury."

Three Coper murals united for the first time after auction purchase and now exhibition

The Hans Coper (1920-81) mural sold at auction in November at a German saleroom – as reported in *ATG* No 2671 – will be going on display in the UK this month, it has emerged.

The so-called Powell Duffryn Mural is one of only three murals Coper made and all of them will now feature together for the first time in the *Hans Coper: Resurface* show at The Gallery at The Arc, Winchester, from January 22 to March 24.

Sold in the room for a hammer price of €340,000 (£283,335) at Schops Turowski in Krefeld to an American collector, the Powell Duffryn Mural was originally commissioned in 1961 by the eponymous company to decorate the entrance hall of the firm's London premises in Berkeley Street.

The other two murals went to a Winchester military base and a Yorkshire secondary school.

The Powell Duffryn Mural originally comprised 18 partly interlocking ceramic discs of varying sizes, which were affixed to the concrete wall of the foyer, covering a 2lft 4in x 9ft 2in (6.5 x 3m) area in total.

After only three years, the company decided to move the mural to a new hanging space. The firm, however, was not

prepared to pay the fee that Coper demanded for the re-hanging and went ahead without him, changing the composition.

By the time the work was sold at Christie's in 1985, two discs had been lost.

It was knocked down for £38,000 but subsequently the mural disappeared from view. According to the Schops Turowski catalogue, the work had been in the 'private possession of a major German ceramic collector' since February 1985.

Experimental phase

Made shortly after Coper's first solo exhibition and after leaving Lucie Rie's Albion Mews studio, these murals heralded a new, experimental phase, and were created in his new studio in Digswell, Hertfordshire. All were sitespecific and commissioned for

buildings or spaces that were constructed in the 1960s.

Coper was commissioned by the Royal Army Pay Corps (RAPC), crafting a 10ft high mural that originally adorned Winchester's Worthy Down barracks. This mural depicted a stripped back and simplified version of the RAPC cap badge, sitting above the RAPC's motto Fide et Fiducia (in faith and trust), with the badge's lion emblem looking out over the Hampshire countryside. The cream of the ceramics and the brown back plate would deliberately have contrasted with the barracks' red brick

The mural was removed decades ago, and has not been on public display since, but plans are in place for it to be permanently installed at Winchester's Adjutant General Corps Museum.

The other mural, consisting of several double-sided stoneware discs, each with distinct surfaces either glazed with black manganese or layered with porcelain slips, was designed to be installed at Rotherham's Swinton School in 1961. It was rescued from the school's demolition in 2009 and although it had a brief tour in London and Japan, has not been publicly displayed since.

The exhibition will also feature over 20 of the artist's pots, and will include items that have rarely, if ever, been on public display before, such as clay prints, the mould for an acoustic wall tile and a large, incised plaster panel.

Accompanying these are photographs of Coper taken by his wife, Jane (1932-2022), in his Digswell studio around the time he was making the murals.

Luce Garrigues, who joined LAW full time in 2017 and replaced Amelia Higgins as director in 2023, has left the company along with Francesca Rumiato and Megan Corcoran Locke.

"The board of London Art Week has not taken this difficult decision lightly, but after more than 10 successful years and listening to our community of participants, we appreciate that the pre-contemporary art market in London has changed considerably in recent years, and that a new approach and an increased level of investment, the latter of which has unfortunately not proved possible, will be required to uphold the principles, standards, and legacy of London Art Week."

LAW was launched in 2013 as a marketing and events platform to unite three previous events: Master Drawings

London (established in 2001), Master Drawings and Sculpture Week (established in 2013) and Master Paintings Week (established in 2009).

The aim was to encourage the pleasures of collecting and connoisseurship through showcasing great works of art and the deep knowledge and experience of London gallerists. In 2017 the initiative became a limited company (formally joining together Master Paintings Week and Master

Drawings and Sculpture Week) and extended its run to include a week during the December 'classic art' season alongside the traditional July slot.

At its peak *LAW* garnered the support (and subscription fees) of more than 50 dealers and enjoyed a strong association with the three major London auction houses.

More recently, after Brexit and the Covid pandemic, numbers have dipped closer to 35 participants (some of them online only) even after *LAW* widened its remit to include a larger selection of decorative as well as fine art.

Significant challenges were posed by the loss of European dealers that have been conspicuous by their absence since the movement of art across the UK border became more complex.

In recent years the event has primarily relied on the support of dealers resident across Mayfair and St James's.

Decorator's desk with the wow factor is latest Buggins fake to make auction return

A faked mahogany partner's desk, made by Dennis Buggins in 1988 and sold shortly afterwards to an interior decorator, has resurfaced at auction. Catalogued by Christie's New York on December 13 as a purely decorative piece, it sold for \$19,000 (£15,150) plus premium.

The desk, with a massive twin-pillar pedestal base and a top inset with four leather writing surfaces, was fabricated using traditional techniques and period elements in the Dennis Buggins workshop in the late 1980s.

The scale and addition to all sides of architectural columns and pediments had given it the wow factor at a time when large antique desks were de rigueur in corporate America. Photos survive of its manufacture in 1988.

The Christie's catalogue stated that it was acquired from dealer Carlton Hobbs in 1989 by Mica Ertegun (1926-2023), a Romanian-American interior designer whose second husband Ahmet Ertegun was the co-founder of Atlantic Records. Her multi-million-dollar collection is currently being sold by Christie's across





a range of sales. It is unknown how the desk was described at the time. Christie's did not reply to ATG's email request for more information.

Buggins has claimed he started working exclusively for brothers Carlton and John Hobbs in 1987 and his association with both dealers continued after they separated. The restorer said that more than half of the items he worked on for BADA dealer John Hobbs (1946-2011) involved alterations or outright

inventions that were passed off as fine antiques.

The legacy of this relationship was brought to light in 2008, when after disagreements and lawsuits between the parties, Buggins went public with his story.

He revealed to *The Sunday Times* both the range of forgeries he had executed and the extent to which his works were accepted by the market.

In response to the allegations, Carlton Hobbs issued a press release in May

2008 referencing "concerns recently expressed in the London antiques community about reproductions and replicas of historical pieces alleged to have been misrepresented as authentic period artefacts".

The company said it would offer an independent and accredited expert assessment, at no cost to their clients, of any item purchased from the firm in the last 15 years.

It added that, should any item be found to have an issue of authenticity or degree of restoration, it would become eligible for Carlton Hobbs' longstanding policy for a full buy-back.

Recently unmasked

Almost two decades since the scandal broke, pieces from this highly creative era are now returning to the market.

Recently unmasked, a pair of neoclassical mahogany and ormolu demilune pier tables set with hardstone cameos, also believed to be Buggins fakes, were sold by Sworders in Essex for £4300 on December 3.

Featured in ATG No 2673, they had been described by John Hobbs as an important pair of Russian tables c.1790 and had been priced at £475,000.

Association and author of the legal textbook *Art Law and the Business of Art*.

Dolman, who joined Phillips as CEO in 2014, will continue in his role until the end of May before moving to a consultancy position. For the last year he has been playing a key managing role in the business after Stephen Brooks resigned as chief executive in January for personal reasons.

Wilson, a leading lawyer in the international art and auction business and the current chairman of BAMF, has been on Phillips' executive board as chief legal officer since 2019. He will now become the company's chief executive officer.

As well as being responsible for Phillips' global legal and compliance functions, he has been "instrumental in securing and executing high-profile sales and managing important client relationships" according to the auction house. Before joining Phillips he spent 20 years at Christie's.

When asked by ATG if he would be staying on as

chairman at BAMF following his new appointment, Wilson said: "No decision has yet been taken but I am in discussions with the Federation members to decide on the best way forward.

"Whether or not I stay on as chairman I will remain heavily involved in BAMF."

Global expansion

Phillips said that under Dolman's leadership its annual sales total had tripled and its digital and global footprint had expanded significantly thanks to the growth in its offices and head count in the Americas, Europe, and Asia, and the opening of new headquarters in Hong Kong, London, Los Angeles, Milan, New York and Paris.

Prior to joining Phillips, he served as director of the office of Her Excellency Sheikha Al Mayassa bin Hamad bin Khalifa Al-Thani, chairperson of the Qatar Museums Authority. In 2012, he was appointed acting chief executive officer of the Qatar Museums.


Before his time in Qatar, Dolman spent 27 years at

Christie's, starting as a porter, then becoming a specialist before later being appointed chief executive, a role in which he served for 11 years before stepping into his final role as chairman of the board of Christie's International.





Pick of the week

St Patrick's relic rings out in electrotype

During the 1860s the South Kensington Museum in London (now the Victoria and Albert Museum) campaigned to have electrotypes made of important historic artefacts.

The relatively new technology, first achieved in 1838 and perfected in the second half of the century, involves taking a wax mould of the original form and electroplating it with a thin shell of copper to create a precise metallic facsimile of a work of art.

The museum believed these copies could aid in the dissemination of knowledge to provincial museums, schools, and libraries in Great Britain and across the world. In 1867, after the signing of the 'Convention for the International Exchange of Works of Art' by 15 of Europe's heads of state, several companies travelled across Europe taking casts of important relics.

The firm Elkington & Co was at the forefront of developments of electro-metallurgy. Financed by the steel pen magnate Josiah Mason, cousins George Richards Elkington and Henry Elkington formed a close relationship with the South Kensington Museum and

made facsimile copies of artefacts for educational purposes and commercial resale.

The auction at Fonsie Mealy in Castlecomer in Co

Kilkenny on December 11-12 included one of its more ambitious projects: the Elkington & Co copy of the shrine for the Bell of St Patrick undertaken in c.1885.

The original, made c.1100 to contain a bell that is reputed to

have been owned by St Patrick in the 5th century, is considered one of the principal relics of Ireland and is on display at the National Museum in Dublin.

In addition to copying the metalwork, glass cabochons were used to replicate medieval jewels. The inside carries a medallion for the *Elkington Dept of Science & Art* and a *Copyright Science and Art Dept* lozenge.

An example of Elkington's shrine is in the collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, while another was sold by Bonhams New York in October 2020 for \$12,000.

The example offered in this Irish auction was estimated at €6000-8000 and hammered at €9500 (£7790) plus 25% buyer's premium inc VAT on top.

From grand style to Bohemian chic

Lyon & Turnbull will sell the art collection of the banker and financier Bernard Kelly (1930-2022) on January 15.

The 314-lot sale in London, offering an eclectic mix of art antiques from Renaissance and Baroque paintings and bronzes to Modern British art, is described by L&T specialist Philip Smith as "part grand European country-house, part bohemian Chelsea flat".

Kelly was born in Brussels, the elder son of Belgium aristocrat Comtesse Renée

Marie Noele Ghislaine de Vaux and Sir David Kelly, a Foreign Office diplomat. He and his wife Mirabel Magdalene Fitzalan Howard had eight children: seven sons and a daughter.

At the heart of the collection is the group of predominantly 16th and 17th century allegorical bronzes and European Old Masters.

However, at a time when early 20th century British art could be bought more reasonably, Kelly also sought works by present day luminaries such as Henri Gaudier-Brzeska, Ceri Richards, John Piper, Eileen Agar and Roger Fry.

Bespoke jewellery taken from home

The Metropolitan Police is appealing for information after jewellery worth £10.4m was stolen from an art collector's Primrose Hill home on December 7.

The burglar made off with bespoke jewellery – including Van Cleef necklaces, two De Beers butterfly diamond earrings and pink Katherine Wang sapphire earrings – as well as £150,000-worth of Hermès Crocodile Kelly

handbags and £15,000 in cash, the police said. The residents were not at home at the time of the incident.

Detective Constable Paulo Roberts said: "This is a brazen offence, where the suspect has entered the property while armed with an unknown weapon and violated the sanctuary of the victims' home.

"The suspect has stolen £10.4m worth of jewellery, much of which is sentimental and unique in its design, and therefore easily identifiable.

"If you have seen this jewellery since, someone has offered to sell you it, or you have any further information, then please also contact the

police or Crimestoppers anonymously."

Norfolk country house sale selection

Essex auction house Sworders is to offer contents from Holkham Hall on February 11.

The saleroom said it has been scouring the attics and cellars, corridors and storerooms of the Norfolk country house since April 2024

alongside Holkham Hall's collections team.

In total, 400 lots have been selected for auction by the Earl and Countess of Leicester which provide a glimpse into the history of the 18th century Palladian house.

Items featuring in Holkham:

The Attic Sale, include the c.1800 Republican Sèvres porcelain 'beau bleu' dessert service shown above and a group of c.190-200 Roman carved marble fragments depicting figures and sea creatures which carries an estimate of £10,000-20,000.

Shannon's model also inspired Augustus John

British artist Charles Haslewood Shannon (1863-1937) is closely associated with the Bloomsbury Group, the collective of writers, intellectuals, and artists in early 20th-century London.

If you own a copy of Orlando, the novel by Bloomsbury stalwart Virginia Woolf, you may well recognise Shannon's portrait The Lady in a Black Hat, Portrait of Miss Rachel Castellani - it adorns the front cover of the edition published in the World's Classics series (Oxford Paperbacks, 1992).

Now, you could even own the original work. Guildford auction house Aubreys is offering the oil painting on January 30 with an estimate of £10,000-15,000.

It comes from the collection of a London gentleman who purchased the painting from an antiques shop in Surrey in 1982.

The work was created in 1915 and was soon exhibited at the Royal Academy of Arts in 1916. The Lady in a Black Hat... depicts a woman with androgynous charm, dressed in highwayman's garb – an attire that was briefly fashionable during the First World War.

Aubreys says: "The identity of the sitter in this painting has long been a subject of intrigue. After extensive research by our specialists, we have uncovered a captivating new lead regarding the mysterious figure of Miss Rachel." They delved into the official archives of The Royal Academy. "While the sitter's surname is widely recognised as 'Castellan,' the 1916 exhibition catalogue listed a slightly different version: 'Castellani.'"

Castellani was a model for the artist Augustus Edwin who painted "a striking portrait of Miss Castellani, titled Rachel, just two years after the completion of Shannon's. This revelation offers new insight into the sitter's identity and the fascinating

> connections between artists of the period."

John's portrait of Rachel resides in the Tate [see tate. org.uk/art/artworks/johnrachel-n03565].

Lowestoft's sense of belonging

Birth tablets with their roots in Suffolk are unique to the factory and boast a long collecting history

Porcelain birth tablets are unique to the Lowestoft factory.

These 3in (7cm) circular blue and white plaques were seemingly made to order to mark the births of local children, many of them christened at the ancient parish church of St Margaret's. They add greatly to the factory's deep sense of place and have a long collecting history.

The Autumn Fine Sale at Keys (25% buyer's premium) in Aylsham on November 27-29 included a good example, decorated with a chinoiserie scene verso and inscribed *Thomas Page born 31 December 1786*.

It was last on the market in 1967 when it was sold at Sotheby's by a Miss M E Page. Her ancestor Thomas Page, the son of Robert and Elisabeth Page, was christened at St Margaret's Church, Lowestoft, on April 25, 1756, and this tablet may well commemorate the birth of his son. It had some damage (a rim chip to front and chip to reverse) and sold at £2300 (estimate £2000-4000).

Prices today are much more restrained than those one or two decades ago. The auction record for a tablet is one inscribed *Thos Anderson Born Sept 13th 1790*. Sold at Phillips in 1996 for £4600, it took £14,000 at Lowestoft porcelain specialist and Suffolk auctioneer Russell Sprake in 2006.



Although the firm did business in London, it seems likely the Lowestoft factory (located for almost half a century on Bell Lane, 1757-1802). survived longer than the average 18th century English porcelain concern by catering to a market in Norfolk and Suffolk.

Named mugs and tankards produced for local families were part of its stock in trade. Offered here with a guide of £3500-4000 was

a 6in (15cm) tankard decorated in underglaze blue with floral sprays and a central cartouche inscribed *Edward* and Mary Jex Yarmouth.

The Jex family were landowners in both Yarmouth and Lowestoft with John Jex a mayor and magistrate who, according to local history, entertained George II when the king was forced ashore during a storm on his way to Hanover.

The jug, last sold as part of the

Hollond collection at Sotheby's in October 1967, took £3500. It has a small hairline.

A 5in (13cm) high sparrow beak jug and cover was particularly rare. Finely decorated Chinese style pattern of a lady with mandolin and another seated at a table with a vase of flowers, it belongs to a small group of Lowestoft porcelains painted in puce camaieu. In good condition, it sold at £3000.

Lowestoft Cannon Ball blasts away estimate

The weekly sale at Gorringe's (25% buyer's premium) in Lewes on November 4 included an English porcelain rarity: a blue and white Cannon Ball pattern beaker and cover.

Although initially catalogued as Liverpool, this was almost certainly a production of the Lowestoft factory, c.1790. A rarity usually referred to as a preserve pot and cover (another is pictured in Geoffrey Godden's *Lowestoft Porcelain*), the cover in particular

evokes the small plaques made to commemorate the births of local children that are among the signature wares of the Suffolk factory (see story above). In good condition apart from a replaced chip to the cover, it raced past its two-figure estimate to sell at £2600.

Only a handful known

The equivalent Lewes sale on October 28 had included a rare Doulton figure: *A Mandarin* HN641. This 8in (20cm) high figure designed by Charles Noke was purportedly issued between 1924-38, although like other figures from this period, the production run must have been very small.

Only a handful are known, although another with same blue and yellow glaze was sold by Bonhams Knightsbridge in August 2020 for £2500.

Gorringe's figure, with a hairline crack to the base, took £4000.

Dresser claret jug proved too pricey to produce in great number

The hugely versatile Christopher Dresser sold 37 different designs to the Sheffield firm of Dixon and Sons from 1879-82.

Not all of them materialised and some that broke Dresser's own rules of cost-effective production were made in only small numbers. A claret jug which came for sale at Mitchells (22% buyer's premium) in Cockermouth, Cumbria, on November 27-29, is one such piece.

The shape, with is distinctive domed lower base sparrow beak spout and angular handle, appears on a page from Dresser's account book for 1881. The design (also at the Linthorpe Pottery) was made by Dixon in electroplate in both a plain undecorated version and, as here, with Aesthetic movement plant-inspired engraving centred by a maltese cross. Standing 8½in (21.5cm), it bears the model number 2546 and Dresser's facsimile signature to the base plus Patent 1529 to the handle.

Mitchells got the cataloguing

right but the estimate of just £50-80 was wide of the mark. It was one of the surprises of the three-day sale when it hammered at £4300.

The jug (in good condition save some wear to the plating) post-dates by a few years the celebrated series of Dresser-Dixon teapots made in 1879. One of these, the Japoniste model 2277 teapot, sold for £63,000

at Cheffins in Cambridge in October.

Mini chest

The other multi-estimate bidding contest was saved for a fine piece of Georgian miniature furniture – a walnut bachelor's chest standing just 7in (17cm) high. With its hinged foldout top and support slide, two

small drawers above two full-length drawers and two side drawers with fitted compartments, it mirrored its full-size exemplar from c.1720-30.

Seemingly a rare survivor from the period, it raced away from its £200-300 guide to bring £13,000 – more than many full-size George I chests of this type would now command at auction.

Chronometer observed in West Sussex saleroom

A stand-out lot of **Bellmans**' (25% buyer's premium) biannual Fine Clocks auction on December 5, was a chronometer made for the 1874 British expedition to observe the transit of Venus.

The Victorian brass-bound rosewood two-day observatory chronometer, made by Charles Frodsham, London, in c.1860 and numbered 3178, was used as the 'mean solar half-seconds chronometer' to observe the planet Venus passing between the sun and earth on Kerguelen Island in the southern Indian Ocean on December 8 1874

The island was one of several locations used by the expedition to observe this rare astronomical phenomenon, with the purpose of measuring the distance between the sun and the earth. Offered nearly 150 years later to the day, the chronometer was well contested, nearly doubling its high estimate to sell for £4800.

In 2021, Bonhams sold a silver Parkinson & Frodsham pocket

chronometer, noted at the time for being "the most accurate of all timekeepers on the expedition", for a premium-inclusive £6120.

An ornate mantel timepiece presented to British army officer and Conservative Party politician,



Brigadier-General Howard Clifton Brown (1868-1946), was another highlight of Bellmans' specialist 128lot sale, where 88% of lots sold.

The 18in (46cm) high clock, designed with a silver-plated equestrian figure of a XII Lancer on a silver stepped base, was gifted to Brown by officers of the XII Royal Lancers on his marriage to Mary Eirene Hodges in 1903.

Designed by the Goldsmiths Company of Regent Street and hallmarked 1902, the lot had been expected to fetch £800-1200 but attracted bids online in the room before the hammer fell at £7000.

A simple and understated early Victorian mantel timepiece by



Benjamin Lewis Vulliamy (1780-1854) drew multiple bids. It would appear to be a good time to offer works by the British clockmaker, who is currently the focus of an exhibition at the Clockmakers' Museum gallery at the Science Museum in South Kensington.

The clock, numbered 1658 and made in c.1845, came in a distinctive case made from Ashford black marble, a limestone quarried from mines near Ashford-in-the Water in Derbyshire. Estimated at £1000-2000, it was knocked down for £6000.

All three clocks were secured by private UK buyers.

Auction Reports Hammer highlights

Crown pin cushion linked to royalty

Pin cushions, including an early 19th century example made from a silk dress reputedly worn by Caroline of Brunswick (1768-1821), were a major feature of Warwick-based Bleasdales' (20% buyer's premium) November 20 timed online sale.

The silk dress fragment, decorated with the Order of the Garter, was divided into four segments to form the top part of a crown-shaped pin cushion.

An old paper circular to the base was inscribed Part of a dress given to Queen Caroline by the silk trade 1820 and worn by her at a concert for the benefit of the North St School, London. Estimated at £200-400, it sold for £1320.

Topping the sale was a 17th century red silk pin cushion embroidered in silver thread with a tree in a jardiniere. Such early examples are rare survivors, with most pin cushions dating to after the industrial revolution when pins became more affordable. This example, which combined needle flannels, pockets and a scissor



sheath, attracted a flurry of bids against a £400-600 estimate and sold for £3160.

Lady's companion boxes were another area of strength in the online sale, led by an English tortoiseshell example that nearly doubled its upper guide to sell for

Part of over 130 lots of Tunbridge ware, sewing boxes and thimbles from the collection of the late



Jennifer Bundock, the set included an "exceptional" pair of steel-bladed scissors, the silver arms designed as seated dogs below floret-decorated rectangular handles.

Different time and place can deliver a different result in this fickle world

The auction market can be a fickle beast and, just occasionally, a different time and place can lead to a vastly different result.

Two recent examples were provided in Edinburgh and in Essex.

Time for bed...

Back in October 2017, Lyon & Turnbull had sold an Arts & Crafts mahogany double bed in the manner of Shapland & Petter for a hammer price of £750 at a sale held in the Scottish capital.

Dated to c.1900, the head and foot boards are each carved with a line from literature: Oh Sleep! It is a gentle thing beloved from Pole to Pole (from The Rime Of The Ancient Mariner), and Tis the Voice of the Sluggard I heard him complain. You have waked me up too early. Must slumber again (from The Life and Adventures of Martin Chuzzlewit).

The bed reappeared for sale with the same catalogue description at Ramsay Cornish (22% buyer's premium), also in Edinburgh, on December 14 when this time it hammered for £6500.

...screen time

The most eagerly contested lot in sale in Sworders' (25% buyer's

premium) sale in Stansted Mountfitchet on December 3-4 was a Louis XV giltwood and silk damask

This ancien regime furnishing was formerly part of the decor in The Green Drawing Room at Warwick Castle. It was one of several rooms created by Robert Greville, 4th

Baron Brooke (c.1638-77) that were later updated during the middle of the 18th century following the marriage between Francis, 8th Baron Brooke (1719-73), and Elizabeth, the daughter of Lord Archibald Hamilton. As the fire screen was made c.1750, there is a good chance it was purchased for the property.

In untouched country house condition save the later fabric, it was last sold in November 2014 when it was bought by the vendor at Cheffins of Cambridge for just £460.

Given the same guide of £400-600 at Sworders a decade later, the fire screen sold at £22,000.

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Dealer duo set Irish eyes smiling

Two sales in London offered personal collection of the Hobarts including artists they had championed

Mary and Alan Hobart, who ran the Pyms Gallery in London for nearly five decades, were influential dealers in a great many senses. And no more so than when it came to Modern Irish art.

The gallery was established in 1974 with premises on Brompton Road. Alan, a budding art dealer, and his wife Mary, an art historian originally from County Monaghan in Ireland, diligently built up the business by specialising in Irish artists – particularly Sir William Orpen, Jack Butler Yeats, John Lavery, Walter Osborne and Mary Swanzy.

Moving to Motcomb Street and then to Mount Street in Mayfair, they branched out into Modern British and European pictures and became familiar with handling works by the likes of Monet, Picasso and Bacon. But they never abandoned their original vocation.

Staging a series of landmark exhibitions and selling prominent works to many of the leading collectors of Irish art over the last 40 years, including Sir Tony O'Reilly, Sir Michael Smurfit, Tony Ryan and BJ Eastwood, the gallery did much to promote Irish art in general.

The Hobarts helped to raise the profile of many artists, including lesser-known names, and worked closely with institutions such as the National Gallery of Ireland (Alan was appointed to the board of the institution by the Taoiseach, no less).

Orpen celebrated

William Orpen (1878-1931) might be described as their first specialisation.

Over the years, the Hobarts bought and sold hundreds of his pictures and, through a series of curated shows, catalogues, books and even the setting up for the Orpen Research Fund in 1996, helped in bringing about a reappraisal of his work (the artist's reputation had become somewhat tarnished following his death, in part due to various feuds with fellow artists such as Augustus John and Wyndham Lewis).

The Pyms Gallery celebrated his achievements and demonstrated the power of his works and, in so doing, effectively reinvented the Orpen market

So it was no surprise that when the couple's personal collection came up for auction at the end of 2024 works by the artist featured prominently.

The consignment of 198 lots to Christie's (26/21/15% buyer's premium) and a further 183 to Roseberys (26/25/20% buyer's premium) came about after Alan died in 2021 and Mary in February last year.

The works were drawn from their homes at Farm Street in

Mayfair and Cap Ferrat in southern France. As well as pictures which comprised the bulk of the collection, some carefully chosen pieces of furniture, decorative arts and design, as well as the modern art reference library that the Hobarts lived alongside, were on offer.

On the front foot

In terms of works by Orpen, Christie's offered 14 pictures at its dedicated sale in London on November 19. Thirteen of them sold for a combined £1.85m including premium, providing a decent chunk of the overall £6.08m total from the sale.

The two top sums from the group came for paintings dating from











Orpen's work turned more towards conveying the horrors of war



during the First World War when Orpen headed to the Western Front as an Official War Artist. Works from this period are rarely available, in part due to the fact that many were originally exhibited at Orpen's *War* show at Agnew's in May 1918, and the artist donated its entire contents to the fledgling Imperial War Museum.

One of the works at Christie's was the *The Thinker on the Butte de Warlencourt*, a prime example of his wartime output.

The 3ft x 2ft 6in (92 x 77cm) signed oil on canvas from 1918 was executed not long after the artist had completed his formal portraits of military leaders, including Field Marshal Douglas Haig and Major General Hugh Townsend of the Royal Flying Corps.

Orpen had subsequently travelled along the long straight road from Arras to Bapaume, passing shattered villages and reaching the Somme at a point looking toward the hillock, or 'butte', of Warlencourt.

As he did so the artist's work turned more towards conveying the horrors of war and depicting the exhausted soldiers.

The Thinker's subject here is also thought to have derived from Auguste Rodin's most famous work, which may well have been in Orpen's mind following the French sculptor's death in November 1917.

The picture had last sold at auction at Sotheby's in 1989 for £34,000. It subsquently entered a UK private collection and the Hobarts acquired it from that source in February 1995. While it is not known how much they paid for *The Thinker*, the price was probably significantly less than the £400,000-600,000 Christie's estimate placed for the current sale.

On the day, the painting hammered at £600,000 – a sum that stands in the top 10 auction prices for Orpen according to Artprice. com but the highest so far for a work with the wartime subject. Christie's said it could not disclose any buyer information for any of the lots in the sale.

Two lots later, another wartime scene had also appeared at Sotheby's in 1989, selling to the Hobarts for £19,000. Changing Billets, Picardy was a slightly later work from 1918, dating from Orpen's second tour of the trenches when his pictures became more allegorical.

The 3ft x 2ft 6in (92 x 76cm) signed oil on canvas was based on a drawing he produced on the Arras road and shows a soldier resting on kit-bags as his comrade passionately embraces a barefoot woman as bomb-blasted ruins and searchlights dominate the scene.

Orpen waited until the winter of 1929 before exhibiting *Changing Billets, Picardy* along with two other works to the New English Art Club. According to the press, these pictures were a reminder of the artist's 'amazing technical ability' expressing the 'full variety of moods – satire, sentiment, comedy'.

Estimated at £250,000-350,000, this was another lot that sold on top estimate and again represented a major increase on the price paid by the Hobarts 35 years ago.

Theatrical flair

Another high price came for a rather different work painted in 1915, before Orpen's war service – although again he did not exhibit it until afterwards. *The Poet*, a 3ft 7in x 2ft 10in (1.1m x 86cm) signed oil on canvas, depicted the artist Séan Keating (a one-time apprentice of Orpen) reading with

theatrical flair as Evelyn St George reclines on a sofa.

It was a well-known work which had a long exhibition history (including having appeared at the Orpen show at the Imperial War Museum in 2005 which travelled to the National Gallery of Art in Dublin) and it had provenance to Orpen's muse and lover Mrs Evelyn St George. The Hobarts had bought it back in 1985.

Estimated at £200,000-300,000 at Christie's, it was eventually

knocked down at £400,000.

Yeats in the Dublin rhythm

The top lot of the Christie's sale was O'Connell Bridge by Jack Butler Yeats (1871-1957). Another work with a long exhibition history, it shows passers-by crossing the bridge over the River Liffey with the buildings along the bank and rushing waters painted with typically fluid brushwork.

The Christie's catalogue described it as placing the viewer "at the very heart of the city, immersed in the rhythm of Dubliners as they go about their daily lives".

The 18in x 2ft (46 x 6lcm) signed oil on canvas was bought from James Adam & Sons in Dublin back in 1986, and here had an estimate of £400,000-600,000. With a number of parties prepared to take a punt on a work with a such an inherently attractive subject, it overshot this level and was knocked down at £700,000, the highest price for the artist at auction for three years and certainly notable sum for a work of this size in any case.

Augustus John jubilation

Meanwhile, among a scattering of records at the Christie's sale was the highest price at auction for an oil painting by Augustus John (1878-1961). An Afternoon in Dorset, an 11¾ x 18in (30 x 46cm) oil on panel from 1914, depicted two women sitting together within a rural idyll. One of the sitters was Dorelia McNeill, the artist's second wife and most enduring subject, who was shown to the right side of the painting sporting a spotted headscarf.

With John's studies of his closest acquaintances and relatives being the most commercial part of his oeuvre, and this example featuring vibrant colours and showing his bold handling and execution, it surpassed an £80,000-120,000 estimate and made £170.000.

In terms of all-time prices for the artist at auction, only a chalk study of Edie McNeill (the younger sister of Dorelia) that made an exceptional \$390,000 (£280,185) at Christie's New York in 2021 has fetched more.

Amazing Grace

A significant record came for Grace the Hobarts' legacy

Henry (1868-1953) when another vintage Post-Impressionist picture titled *The Rosary* appeared on the auction block with a £20,000-30,000 pitch. The depiction of a woman in Connemara reciting prayers using beads had previously made a landmark price when it sold for £18,000 at Christie's in 2000 where it was acquired by the Hobarts.

The 16 x 14in (40 x 36cm) signed oil on canvas from c.1910 had been exhibited at The Irish Race Conference in Paris in 1922 – an event intended to provide a platform for Ireland to represent itself as an independent nation through culture.

With this giving it extra appeal in terms of its place in Irish art history, here it sold at £38,000 – again raising the bar for the artist as it surpassed the previous auction high of €37,000 (£31,349) set by another portrait of a seated lady titled *The Fortune Teller* that sold at Whyte's of Dublin in 2021.

Along with records for Rita Duffy (b.1959) and designer Line Vautrin (1913-97) at Christie's, such results were a fitting testament to the Hobarts who did much to champion female artists such as Dod Procter, Eileen Agar, Mary Swanzy as well as Grace Henry.

In this regard they too were a bit ahead of their time and the current rises in each of these artists' markets

Buyer loves Williams

Roseberys' tranche of the Hobart collection, offered in south London, as a dedicated auction a week later on November 26, also generated plenty of good bidding. The auction raised £142,855 with 148 of the 183 lots selling (80%).

The top lot, a **Gertrude Williams** (1877-1934) bronze sculpture from 1901 titled *The Lovers* drew competitive internet bidding and overshot a £2000-3000 estimate, selling at £9000 to a UK buyer.

Works by the Scottish sculptor who collaborated with the architect Robert S Lorimer on three major war memorials, most famously the Scottish National War Memorial in Edinburgh (1927), have appeared at auction only very occasionally. Artprice.com records only seven results, of which this was the highest so far.

Six works by Orpen were on

also offer at the West Norwood auction, all drawings which sold for a combined £8200. One of them was a pencil sketch for the larger painting *The Poet* (which sold at Christie's, as mentioned earlier) which fetched £900, but the best interest came for a pen, ink and wash of Orpen's studio in Chelsea.

His home in Chelsea was a frequent subject in his work and this example dating from c.1902-7 and measuring 9 x 8½in (23 x 21cm) was described in the catalogue as highlighting "the intimacy of Orpen's craft, capturing the comfortable and stylish environment he created for his sitters". The Hobarts had bid £3100 for the work at a Sotheby's auction in 2001. It had since featured at the William Orpen: Method & Mastery exhibition at the Watts Gallery in Guildford in 2019.

At Roseberys it was estimated at £800-1200 and here marginally eclipsed the sum at its previous auction appearance, being knocked down at £3200 to a US buyer.

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Dod Procter 1920s works figure strongly in saleroom bidding battles

Over the last decade, portraits from the 1920s by **Dod Procter** (1891-1972) have become increasingly valuable.

The period is regarded as a high point of her career – famously her 1926 picture *Morning* was awarded picture of the year at the Royal Academy and was subsequently bought for the nation by the *Daily Mail*. It is now in Tate Britain.

Two portraits that came up recently at auction, coincidentally on the same day, demonstrated their continued commercial appeal.

Single figures

Throughout the 1920s, Procter painted a series of striking Modernist works depicting single figures, sometimes nude, others in softly draped clothes.

One which the artist seemingly laboured over, however, appeared at Christie's sale of the collection of the late art dealers Mary and Alan Hobart on November 19 (see main story this week for more background details).

Procter began the painting of the artist and designer Eileen Mayo in 1922 and finished it two years later. At the time, Mayo was much in demand as an artist's model and posed for Dame Laura Knight, Duncan Grant and Vanessa Bell among others. Shown in a relaxed pose and with her eyes closed, the Christie's catalogue described it as being "painted with great sensitivity, indicative of a close bond between the artist and sitter". Bidders clearly agreed.

The 2ft lin x 16½in (64 x 42cm)





oil on canvas, which was signed and dated 1924, was estimated at £30,000-50,000 but, after a strong competition broke out, was eventually knocked down at £110,000 (£138,600 with premium) – the second-highest price at auction for Procter behind only the £115,000 for *Girl with a Parrot* that sold at Christie's in 2015.

Lancelot spotted

Meanwhile, over at Chorley's (23.5% buyer's premium) in Gloucestershire on the same day, a more unusual portrait of a male sitter by Procter emerged from a local source. Again, it was offered with what proved to be a conservative estimate.

The 17 x 13in (43cm x 33cm) signed oil on canvas depicted Lancelot Simpson, a young man that the artist had met in Hampstead and offered to paint in the mid-1920s. It came to auction from a descendant of the sitter following a recent death in the family.

Chorley's pointed to the date of the work and the "intriguingly androgynous appearance" of the sitter as being a major draw for collectors.

Pitched at £6000-8000, it sparked another strenuous competition and was taken to

£50,000, selling to a UK private buyer.

Zinkeisen top price

Another lot generating interest in Gloucestershire was an intriguing picture by Anna Katrina Zinkeisen (1901-76) – another female artist whose work has undergone a significant rise in value over the

last few years.

All the Colours
of the Rainbow, a



20 x 2ft (51cm x 62cm) signed oil on canvas from 1942, was commissioned by Imperial Chemical Industries to promote the production of chemical dyes. Despite its commercial origins, Zinkeisen produced a dreamlike and surreal piece that was arguably among her finest pictures.

The arresting composition of a woman sewing a quilt against a bucolic, ethereal backdrop had strong echoes of Surrealism and was


thought by the auction house to be an unusual if not unique subject in the artist's body of work.

It had remained in the ICI corporate collection until 2002, after which it was owned by the private collector Rose Grimond before coming to Chorley's from the estate of a retired antique dealer.


Estimated at £1000-1500, it drew a strong contest with six phone lines booked in addition to bidding from the room and online.

It eventually sold at £15,000 to a UK trade buyer, eclipsing the previous auction record for the artist: the £12,000 for *Julia and Starkey*, a portrait of a woman with her cat that sold at Bonhams in 2021.

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Memoir tells tale of a man who backed settlements of free slaves

Rare opportunity to buy contemporary account of Paul Cuffee arises at Gloucestershire saleroom


A scarce lifetime biography of the renowned pan-Africanist Paul Cuffee (1759-1817) found plenty of competition at **Dominic Winter** (20% buyer's premium) on December 12.

Estimated at £300-500, Memoir of Captain Paul Cuffee, A Man of Color, issued by Liverpool printer Egerton Smith in 1811, took £5000 at the auction in South Cerney, Gloucestershire.

The son of an emancipated African slave and a Wampanoag Indian, Cuffee was a Massachusetts merchant, whaler and an influential figure in the back-to-Africa movement.

Championing the cause of African colonisation in the years following the British abolition of the slave trade in 1807, he made several trips to Sierra Leone in an effort to settle freed slaves.

This 12-page biographical sketch, priced at three pence, was reprinted from an article that had appeared in *The Liverpool Mercury* in 1811, its founding year. Beginning with two

lines from William Cowper poem *The Negro's Complaint* (1877) – 'Skins may differ, but affections Dwell in Blacks and Whites the same' – it contains an outline of Cuffee's life, struggles and successes.

The text references the difficulties as a ship's captain at a time when 'a vessel owned and commanded by a black man, and manned with a crew of the same complexion, was unprecedented and surprising...' and records the creation of the first racially integrated school in America, established by Cuffee on lands he owned in Westport, Massachusetts.

The account says that '[he] worked in earnest and had a suitable house built on his own ground, which he freely gave up to the use of the public, and the school was opened to all who pleased to send their children'.

It ends by noting that Cuffee has recently been received into the Society of Friends (a rare event in America at the time). Two years later, in 1813, he donated half the money for a new Quaker meeting house in Westport, a building that still stands today.

Most surviving copies of this simple stitched booklet are in institutional collections. Save some spotting and light browning, this example was 'as issued'.

In 1812, A Man of Color was reprinted with the addition of The Epistle of the Society of Sierra Leone, the brief mission statement of a mutual-aid merchant group formed by Cuffee and other black entrepreneurs in Sierra Leone in the hope of furthering prosperity and industry in the colony.

The Conspicuous Gallantry Medal (CGM) group of six awarded to 20-year-old Chief Petty Officer (Air) Donald Arthur 'Don' Bunce is estimated at £80,000-100,000 by Noonans of Mayfair on January 15.

Already a veteran of the celebrated Swordfish attack against the German flagship, *Bismarck*, in May 1941, Bunce won his CGM in February 1942.

Bunce was a Telegraphist Air Gunner in 825 Naval Air Squadron in the Fleet Air Arm (FAA). In early 1942, 825NAS was ordered to RAF Manston as part of Operation 'Fuller', the much-flawed plan to counter the anticipated breakout of enemy capital ships from Brest to reach their home ports, namely the battle cruisers Scharnhorst and Gneisenau and the heavy cruiser Prinz Eugen.

When indeed the ships made their bid for freedom – what became known as the Channel Dash – the response mounted by air and sea proved entirely inadequate. Apart from anything else, the breakout was enacted in daylight, whereas 'Fuller' had been planned



around a nocturnal attempt. Moreover, the Germans had assembled a formidable defensive screen, the three capital ships being covered by six destroyers and 34 E-boats, and a mass of Me 109s and Fw 190s.

Having rendezvoused his small flight of Swordfish with just 10 Spitfires of 72 Squadron over Ramsgate – not the intended escort of five whole squadrons – the force's leader, Lieutenant-Commander Eugene Esmonde, dived in an almost kamikaze attack to just

40ft over the Channel and set off in pursuit. Less than 20 minutes later, his entire flight had been shot down, with just five of the 18 aircrew surviving the ordeal, including Bunce whose Swordfish was severely damaged and had to crash-land into the sea. Esmonde was awarded a posthumous Victoria Cross.

Bunce, the only non-commissioned airman, was awarded the CGM, one of only two awarded to men $\,$

in the FAA during the Second World War. The CGM (discontinued in 1993) was the second highest bravery award for ratings of the Royal Navy, ranking below the VC.

The medal group is being sold by the estate of a private collector.

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Collector Interview

Why acquiring another gramophone

Christopher Proudfoot is the president of The City of London Phonograph and Gramophone Society (CLPGS). The society was formed in 1919 as the London Edison Society and is the oldest recorded music society in the world. Its interests lie mainly in old music and performers, the history of the industry, cylinder and disc records, and the machines on which to play them.

The society has over 500 members worldwide, though the majority are in the UK. Its journal *For The Record* is published four times a year.

Here Proudfoot tells *ATG* about his own gramophone collecting habit.

Born in 1946, in Bromley, Chris Proudfoot suspects the collecting bug was in his blood from the moment he became conscious. He also feels quite strongly about this borough: "Bromley is in Kent," declares Proudfoot. "Despite the efforts of ignorant people to place it in 'South East London'."

Long before his romance with gramophones, it seems the die was cast in childhood; he cannot remember a time when he did not need to have objects around him.

"I never set out to 'start a collection', as I am told some people do," he says. "I have always had a tendency to acquire anything old fashioned, especially mechanical things. When I was seven, I was given a very battered old portable gramophone, with four broken records. I was scornful of those modern plastic things that other people had – this was the mid-1950s.

"My derelict gramophone ceased to function after a time and my parents bought me, for my birthday in 1957, a brand-new version of the same HMV portable. It had been introduced in 1931, and was still available until 1960, when the final

demise of 78s put a stop to the sale of wind-up gramophones."

A few years later, when Proudfoot was at school in London, a friend told him about the Gramophone Exchange in Wardour Street, which sold second-hand 78s. He became a habitué of this strange establishment, presided over by George Russell, who founded it in 1912 (or even 1906 according to some accounts). Classical 78s were mostly one shilling each, and he started building a collection of the basic symphonic works.

Proudfoot notes: "Sadly, these records are now not worth even 5p, never mind whatever the inflationary equivalent of that sum is today."

Habit forming

If the definition of a 'collection' is exemplified by having two of an item, then Proudfoot's gramophone collecting habit started around 1963.

"In a junk shop near Victoria Station, I found a mahogany table model which was mine for 30 bob 'but you can have it for 25/-'. I was too naïve then to realise that I could probably have knocked it down to £1 or even 10/-, but I have never regretted buying it, for I later learnt

that it was quite a rare machine. It was made in the early 1920s by an offshoot of Waring & Gillow, using a tone-arm and sound box from Henry Seymour, a leading experimenter in phonograph and gramophone design, who contributed in a similar way to the first EMGs."

Over the ensuing years, Proudfoot bought from junk shops, auctions, and occasionally other collectors and specialist dealers. He admits that purchasing from the latter two is less enjoyable as the element of discovery is lacking – which is key to his collecting joy.

"The person you are buying from knows exactly what he is selling (it was never a she!)," he says. "There is none of that satisfaction that can be had from rescuing something from oblivion. I have used eBay but not recently – all too often, prices go above a reasonable level, due no doubt to buyers new to the subject who are as ignorant of 'going rates' as some of the sellers! I think the most I have ever spent was £3000, though I have been known to underbid at a much higher level."

Now aged 77, Proudfoot has a house that is so full of gramophones

that half of them are hidden from sight, so he buys very few at present. He has about 240 gramophones and phonographs, but surely there must be an elusive piece that would crown his collection?

"There is nothing I am specifically looking for, apart from a Kämmer Reinhardt gramophone of c. 1890, but as these are now selling in the £20,000s, I am unlikely ever to fill that gap. My collection has two main themes; Gramophone Company products (HMV), and unusual portables."

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always sounds like a great idea



related," he says. "Needle tins, record cleaners, fibre cutters, thorn sharpeners, related books – and, of course, records. I am not a record collector (they are another breed, though a few own a gramophone or two as well), but I have accumulated a fair quantity over the years. I certainly play them on gramophones for listening pleasure, particularly on an EMG or an Expert – still the best way to listen to 78s, in many people's opinion."

Proudfoot has some advice for beginners, suggesting they should buy what appeals to them personally and, for extra wisdom, study prices before starting.

"Grasp the opportunity of a lifetime within the lifetime of the opportunity," he says. "If you make a mistake, put it down to experience; it's the best way to learn.

"Originality is the key, and experienced collectors tend to set great store by this. When you start, you may not be able to detect changes and restorations – but if something is described as 'restored', be very wary!"

One might imagine that the world of gramophones would be free from the curses of counterfeit goods and

cheeky replicas, but it seems that particular record is a ubiquitous long player. Proudfoot is particularly vocal with regards to gramophones that come with "fancy brass horns".

He says, "These have been crudely built in India in the past 40 years, often with fake HMV trade marks (it is still a registered trade mark, now owned by the HMV shops, so this is an infringement). They are favourites with TV and film producers, who

think that any interior setting earlier than about 1940 needs one of these anachronistic horrors."

Proudfoot doesn't wish to romanticise or justify his hobby and has no plans to turn his home into a museum. He rarely sells any items from his collection and admits that when he has, he's later regretted it.

"My collecting habit is barmy – like most collecting habits," he admits. "But I enjoy finding things,

repairing them and researching them. My collection is too plentiful to be displayed effectively, though my study has them on shelves round two walls, and many of the portables are in cupboards. It is essentially a reference collection – questions arise, often in connection with the CLPGS journal, which I edit, and I can refer to a particular machine to see how something was done and when."

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Dealers' diary

The portal to a secret past

Portrait miniatures can pack in plenty of hidden messages says specialist ahead of a dedicated exhibition

Emma Rutherford admits to being "a very boring child" who became fascinated by history at the age of 10 or 11.

Her parents took the young Rutherford to Hever Castle in Kent, because she was particularly interested in Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn. Once the seat of the Boleyn family, the 14th century castle was hosting an exhibition which featured a loaned portrait miniature, purported to be of Anne Boleyn. In many ways, this experience sowed the seeds for what would become Rutherford's flowering vocation.

She began her career working in the Victoria and Albert Museum while completing an MA in Victorian art and architecture. She then set up the portrait miniatures department at auction house Phillips and after the amalgamation of that firm with Bonhams she became departmental director.

After a period working at the Philip Mould Gallery, in 2023 Rutherford established The Limner Company, which houses a group of specialists who work together researching and selling antique portrait miniatures.

Eternal fascination

It's hard not to wonder what was it about the Tudor period in history that entranced Rutherford as a young girl.

"I think it's that period in history which feels just about in touching distance," she says. "We have enough material culture to know how the Tudors lived, but not quite enough documented on how they really felt. So it's a fantastic period for research with enough mystery to keep it eternally fascinating."

Thanks to Hilary Mantel's Wolf Hall and the BBC adaption of her books, it seems there's a wider interest in the Tudor period. As an expert in that period, has she been watching Mark Rylance breathe life into Thomas Cromwell?

"Of course!" she admits. "I even rewatched *Wolf Hall* for the second time before *The Mirror and the Light* came out. It's almost unbearable to watch these final episodes knowing what's coming."



The historian Patrick Collinson wrote: "It is possible for competent historians to come to radically different conclusions on the basis of the same evidence. Because, of course, 99% of the evidence, above all, unrecorded speech, is not available to us."

Some historians can be very sniffy about historical fiction, but Rutherford is open to enjoying it, especially when crafted by careful hands. "So much of history is filling in the gaps that I feel as long as it's not too far-fetched I can accept it. I'm an awful companion for anything historical on TV though – I'm always complaining about Tudor teeth looking too good."

The Reflected Self, an exhibition currently showing at Compton Verney in Warwickshire until February 23, is co-curated by Rutherford and uses as its focus the art of portrait miniature.

These paintings flourished in Britain for over 300 years. While

these artworks were once enjoyed by Queen Elizabeth I, they were eventually overshadowed by the invention of photography.

This exhibition has a focus on Compton Verney's impressive collection of portrait miniatures, with loans from the Dumas Egerton Trust Collection and private lenders. It includes works by all of the leading miniaturists to have worked in Britain since the mid-16th century including Nicholas Hilliard, Isaac Oliver, Samuel Cooper, Richard Cosway and John Smart.

Secret side of the past

Rutherford explains what makes miniatures intrinsically fascinating, even if artworks on a grander scale tend to grab the public's attention.

"Miniatures are the portal where we get to see the secret side of the past," she says. "They were so personal, so often hidden and reveal so much that despite their size, they hold the key to personal and political allegiances. The larger oil portraits, due to their public nature, are a performance of perfection – miniatures are like the secret diary."

The petite masterpieces performed several functions: as emblems of passion and loyalty, diplomatic gifts traded between foreign courts or as symbols of royal favour. They were like the WhatsApp messages of their day – intimate, high impact and potentially ruinous.

The exhibition is titled *The Reflected Self* as initial discussions about the topic inspired Rutherford to describe miniatures as "the closest we get to looking in a mirror at a reflection of the past – and this became a theme which stuck".

Feeling sensitive

modern curator, and this show was no exception.

"Where to start?' asks Rutherford. "Despite being relatively robust objects in their time – worn, carried and handled – portrait miniatures were painted in watercolour and, from around 1720, painted on a support of ivory – so they are sensitive to light and variations in temperature.

"Together with the curators at Compton Verney we wanted to get across the way in which miniatures were worn and handled in a variety of ways – so we have every case displaying the miniatures in a different way – hanging on ribbons, revolving on stands, displayed with original clothing and held in wooden hands. I am so pleased with the end result but I won't pretend that it was easy to get everything to stay in place with the conservation restrictions around museum objects."

Asked for recommendations of works for people to look out for, Rutherford's enthusiasm and knowledge is irresistible.

"It would be remiss of me to leave out the discovery of the show," she says. "A miniature of Mary I as princess, painted just before her father, Henry VIII's death, c.154647. Due to the dating it is most likely to have been painted by a woman artist called Susanna Horenbout. It was very exciting to reveal this in the press a few weeks ago just as *The Mirror and the Light* came on TV!

"There are some beautiful miniatures in the show, but also some which were clearly special to the families who owned them. One of my favourites is by another woman artist called Diana Hill, who was working in India in the 1780s, showing a man with a distinctive underbite – at a time when it was considered rude to show one's teeth in public, this just shows the candid nature of portrait miniatures long before photograophy was invented."

Despite her passion for the works in *The Reflected Self*, it's an absence that Rutherford's heart is set on.

"We know that Henry VIII and Ann Boleyn exchanged portraits in the form of bracelets, but her image was obliterated after her execution. To find another image of her would be magical, especially at this moment in their relationship when Henry was so besotted."

Works shown by Rutherford at the exhibition will be for sale for prices ranging from £2000-40,000. ■

Patrick Boyd-Carpenter is an established fine art dealer with over 40 years' experience in handling paintings, drawings, sculpture and works of art. He is based at Grays Antique Market, London W1 Instagram @pbcfinearts pbcfineart.co.uk



How did you get your start as a dealer?

Initially I ran a Contemporary art gallery in Marble Arch, realising early on that it was much easier to deal with artists if they were long dead. I took a unit at Grays in 1986. There was such a variety of specialist dealers at that time that it proved to be the perfect university to study art and antiques. My focus is works on paper primarily, specialising in 18th century British and Old Master drawings.

Over the years I've encountered many admirable (and not so admirable) dealers and curators. From the museum world I'd give an honourable mention to Sir Timothy Clifford (a tragedy that they didn't give him the V&A). I would say the dealer that I admire most would be my partner Siân Harlowe, a rare expert in and utterly devoted to 17th and 18th century

jewellery, but am under strict orders not to mention her here. So, I would say that from the serried ranks of dealers, I'd select the Asian art dealer Roger Keverne as someone to admire. Such an encourager.

2 What challenges are facing the trade?

Post-Brexit there's been a very cold wind blowing through the London art market from Bond Street to St James's, with a lot of the institutions focusing on their overseas operations. Sad to say, but we seem to be losing our place at the table. On the other hand, I have been receiving a great deal of interest from China in early British watercolours, an area of the market that has been in the doldrums for some time.

What is one great discovery you've made?

That I cannot divulge – all I can say is that it now hangs in a national museum and contributed considerably to my coffers. I do have visiting rights! They used to say that every dealer gets at least three great finds in their career. Some find it day one, and some take years to catch the big one. So don't give up! It's the ones that got away that truly haunt me.

One lesson to learn as a dealer is: never be tempted to make out that something is better than it actually is. Be absolutely straight with your clients and overall try to make them laugh, forging those personal relationships is what's important.

One item you couldn't do without?

I sold my soul long ago and will sell pretty much anything I own to finance my own art buying addiction. Henry Fuseli is the artist for me and it would be hard to be parted.

Your desert island drink of choice?

Many years drinking with the antiquarian book trade, a species with an enormous capacity for alcohol, has led me back to tea.

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Boivin necklace provenanced to pair of prominent socialites

Jewellery dating to c.1960 was once owned by well-known women in New York and Palm Beach

Among the 24l glittering lots in Doyle's (33/32/26% buyer's premium) Important Jewelry auction on October 30, was a René Boivin piece owned by two prominent socialites: one who reigned in New York, and the other in Palm Beach, Florida.

Dating to c.1960, the Boivinsigned adjustable choker-length necklace features a trio of 18ct gold, diamond, and ruby pendant clipbrooches that can be strung on a black or red suede strap.

It boasts 35cts' worth of diamonds with old mine, old mine oval, and old European cuts, 36 stones in all. The 96 rubies have round cuts and are described as 'deep purplish raspberry, slightly included, lively'.

Its provenance included two 'blue blood' Americans. Its first owner was Barbara 'Babe' Paley (1915-78), who served as fashion editor for *Vogue* magazine from 1938 until she married her second husband, CBS founder William Paley, in 1947.

Truman Capote (1924-84), who described her and other select society women of his era as 'swans', reportedly said: "Babe Paley had only one fault. She was perfect."

When an excerpt from Capote's Answered Prayers,

a novel that turned his swans into book characters, appeared in *Esquire* magazine and revealed details of William's philandering, Babe cut the author from her life.

(Paley was played by Naomi Watts in last year's Feud: Capote vs. The Swans, the second season of the US anthology television series Feud which covered the Capote dispute.)

After the René Boivin necklace was auctioned at Sotheby's in October 1992, it came into the possession of Marjorie S Fisher (1923-2016), who co-founded a namesake philanthropic organisation in 1955 with her husband, Max.

At the time of her death, the foundation stated Fisher had dispersed more than \$70m in grants before retiring in 2011. Recipients ranged from the Detroit Symphony Orchestra to the Palm Beach Food Bank. Her generosity also took the form of the Marjorie S Fisher Tooth Fairy Mobile Unit, which provided dental care to Florida children in need.

The Boivin necklace returned to Sotheby's in a December 2016 sale that included jewellery from Fisher's collection when it sold for \$160,000. Doyle had assigned the necklace an estimate of \$120,000-180,000 and it

sold at \$95,000 (£75,000).

Popular luxuries

The most eagerly contested lot was a Cartier Paris Art Deco gold, platinum, onyx, coral, jade, diamond and emerald vanity case or minaudière. These cases are popular luxuries in the Far East, with this piece of extra interest as its central diamond-encrusted motif, worked with a coral pedestal and a cabochon emerald globe, was a guardian lion. Missing coral to the edge would be a relatively simple repair.

Estimated at \$10,000-15,000, it took \$70,000 (£55,000). ■

How French king's mistress concealed her pregnancy

Initially conceived of and worn by Madame de Montespan, Louis XIV's most prominent mistress, to conceal her pregnancies, the robe à la française or sack-back dress became a dominant form of fashion in the mid- to late-18th century.

The dress was known for its box pleating which

fell from the shoulder to the floor in a trainlike presentation. Both formal and informal variations became wildly popular with both French and English women alike. Vermont vintage fashion specialist **Augusta Auctions (25% buyer's premium)** brought a

c.1750 example of the robe à la française to
market on September 25.

Described as in very good condition with only minor repairs, the gown featured a ribbon stripe pattern with a weft-lace motif.

The design then transitioned into a taffeta ground with broché rose buds and included applied pinked horizontal ruffled swags to both the gown and original petticoat.

The gown had been estimated at \$2000-4000 but determined bidders took it to \$7250 (£5550).

Moore bronze comes out of Manhattan

A late but textbook bronze by Henry Moore (1898-1986) sold for \$75,000 (£59,000) at a 145-lot sale held in New York by Auctions

at Showplace (25% buyer's premium) on October 20.

Like many of the leading entries to the sale, it came from a townhouse on the Upper East Side of Manhattan.

Reclining Figure, in a verdigris patinated bronze on an ebonised wood plinth, measuring 7in (18cm) across, was from a signed edition of nine issued in 1983.

This cast, numbered 5/9 to the base, had a full collecting history having first been sold by London dealer James Kirkman and then the Australian dealer Rex Irwin where it had been shown in a 1990 exhibition *Henry Moore:* A *Tribute*.

It had been purchased by the vendor from the Crane Kalman Gallery on Brompton Road in 2017 and sold towards the top of a

\$60,000-80,000 guide. Afra Bianchin (1937-2011) and Tobia Scarpa (b.1937) founded Afra and

Tobia Scarpa in 1960, starting by providing designs for brands such as Gavina, B&B Italia and Benetton (for which they designed a textile factory).

A set of 10 Afra and Tobia Scarpa 'Africa' chairs were designed c.1975 for furniture retailer Maxalto. Made of walnut with brass details, the set was part of the Artona Collection from the Upper East Side. It hammered for \$65,000 (£51,000) against an estimate of \$20,000-40,000.

Fine Finnish

One of biggest names in Finnish post-war lighting turned in a strong performance.

Paavo Tynell (1890-1973) took humble interior illumination and created a legacy that remains highly sought after in the contemporary market.

Tynell worked extensively with Finland's Taito Oy firm, and in c.1950 it released the *Model 10506* brass floor lamp.

The example offered here, estimated at just \$6000-8000, intense bidding took it to a final hammer of \$55,000 (\$43,000), selling to an online bidder via the

LiveAuctioneers platform.

The sale's top lot at \$95,000 (£73,360) was a late but characteristic still-life by Bernard Buffet (1928-99).

Titled Roses Rouges et Lys, the 1996 oil on canvas had twice sold earlier at Sotheby's and came for sale with from a private New York collection with a \$60,000-80,000 estimate.

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Harry Houdini King of Cards poster had been collected by Yorkshireman spellbound by magic

Erik Weisz (1864-1926) launched his monumental career as the illusionist Harry Houdini in 1891 as a specialist in card tricks.

Billing himself as the 'King of Cards,' the performer best remembered as an escape artist developed a diverse library of illusions, including card manipulation, sleight of hand, and other forms of deception.

He started as a sideshow performer but found immense traction and began headlining performing halls worldwide.

Potter & Potter's (25% buyer's premium) annual Halloween sale on October 26 included an original 1898 half-sheet promotional poster titled Harry Houdini King of Cards.


Printed in two colours by National Printing and Engraving, Chicago, the 2ft 4in x 21in (70 x 53cm) lithograph features a central image of the illusions along with two smaller insets depicting the magician doing fancy cuts and arm spreads.

It was part of the collection of Edwin Alfred Dawes (1925-2023), the Yorkshire biochemist and magician who was also an internationally recognised authority on the history of magic.

Estimated at \$10,000-15,000, the poster took \$22,000 (£17,400).

Another Houdini lot topped the Dawes collection.

Guided at \$3000-5000 but sold at \$28,000 (£21,840) was a signed presentation copy of the first edition of The Unmasking of Robert-Houdin, Houdini's account of the life of the 'father of modern magic' published in 1908.

Houdini had a deep admiration for Robert-Houdin but in his research found the man who had inspired his stage name and persona had taken credit for tricks created by others before his time.


This copy of his 'unmasking' was a generally clean one but its reading To my friend Okito with compliments and best wishes from the author Harry Houdini, New York, author HH.

Tobias 'Theo' Bamberg (1875-1963) was a professional magician who (although almost completely deaf) performed a Japanese-style act under the name Okito (an anagram of Tokio) and was billed on posters as The Mystic.

A skilled propmaker for his fellow musicians in Europe and North America, he returned to his native Netherlands just as the Nazis invaded and, as a Dutch Jew, all of his possessions were either confiscated or destroyed.

He ended his last years in Chicago, where this book was sold.

Handy for a bit of sharp practice at the table

Gambling today - particularly card playing - is a largely sanitised affair, occurring in luxurious settings under strict observation in town centre

It is a far cry from the smoky bars and gambling houses from the days of yore when professional gamblers were commonplace, and some of the more enterprising examples often used cheating devices to slip in a needed card at critical moments during a game.

Discovery of such a device could be very hazardous to health and well-being, so the contraptions became more sophisticated with the passage of time.

Central Mass Auctions (20% buyer's premium) brought one such device likely from the early 20th century to market on October 22. The gambler would strap the machine to his arm, and when a brass lever was pushed, a telescoping arm would push forward a hidden card to the gambler's hand, just in time for play.

Still in great working condition, Central Mass estimated the lot to bring \$300-1000 but it hammered at \$5000 (£3880) at the auction staged in Worcester, Massachusetts.
